Pentecost Sunday

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend we celebrate Pentecost,
which marks the end of the Easter
season. As this joyful season draws to
a close, this great feast reminds us of
the continuing role of the Holy Spirit

in the life of the community. As we celebrate the outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon the disciples on the first Pentecost, we call to mind that it is the same Spirit, given to us at Baptism and Confirmation, that continues to guide the Church, keeps us holy and makes us one. Let us pray today that we, as a parish family, may be truly open to the Holy Spirit, that we may go where the Holy Spirit leads us and that we may find greater unity in the Holy Spirit.

Pentecost is often seen as the "Birthday of the Church" since, with the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, the disciples of Jesus were no longer individuals but were united as one. It is so important for us to remember that the Holy Spirit is what makes us one even today. Even before the pandemic society-- including the Church - was becoming more fractured. We seemed to place all our emphasis on that which divides us from others, to look at those differences as absolute, and to define ourselves by who we are not. The Holy Spirit doesn't make us all the same, but the Spirit can bring about unity even in our differences. As we pray for the Holy Spirit to come upon us today, let us pray that He begins to bring about that unity by helping us to see those who are different from us, those who hold positions contrary to ours - in the church, in the country, in the world - not as our enemies, not as "other," but as sisters and brothers. As sisters and brothers united in the Holy Spirit let us together seek to follow not my way or your way or their way, but rather, the Spirit's Way, for that's the Way that leads to the Kingdom!

St. Joan of Arc

May 30th was the feast of St. Joan of Arc, the patroness of France. Joan was born to a peasant family in Champagne, France in the early 15th century.

From a young age she heard the voices of St. Michael, St. Catherine, and St. Margaret speaking to her. Then, in 1428,

when she was 13 years old, she received a vision telling her to go to the King of France and help him reconquer his kingdom from the invading forces of England and Burgundy.

Overcoming opposition and convincing members of the court and of the Church, she was given a small army. She charged into battle bearing a banner which bore the names "Jesus" and "Mary" as well as a symbol of the Holy Spirit.

Due to her leadership and trust in God, she was able to raise the siege of Orleans in 1429. Joan and her army went on to win a series of battles. Because of her efforts, the king was able to enter Rheims. He was crowned with Joan at his side.

Eventually, Joan was captured by the forces of Burgundy in May of 1430. When her own king and army did nothing to save her, she was sold to the English. She was imprisoned for a time and then put on trial. Bishop Peter Cauchon of Beauvais presided over her trial. His hope was that in being harsh with Joan, the English would help him become archbishop.

Joan was condemned to death on counts of heresy, witchcraft, and adultery. On May 30, 1431, she was burned at the stake in Rouen, France. She was 19 years old.

Thirty years after her death, her case was retried and she was exonerated. In 1920, she was canonized by Pope Benedict XV. She is the patroness of France, captives, soldiers, and those ridiculed for their piety.


