

## A Message from the Pastor

Our readings this Sunday offer an important reminder for us, however, we might well add that it is not a reminder we would be quick to welcome. It is true: God permits hardships to exist in our lives, and not all of our prayers are answered in the affirmative. Again, probably something we know all too well, and something we don't want to be reminded of. Today we even hear that St. Paul—who is among the all-time greatest responders to God's grace—knew the disheartening experience of prayers going unanswered or at least answered differently than desired. "Three times I begged the Lord to remove the thorn..." but he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness." (2 Cor 12:8-10) But what consolation does the Word of God offer us? What are we to make of this?

Well, one silver lining, since regular suffering was a reality for St. Paul, our experience of hardships has nothing to do with God grading our personal holiness or lack of holiness. This is a very good thing. Piecing together the context of our first reading from Ezekiel, we can consider there was a time in the Old Testament where hardships were inflicted on people as punishments, especially when it came resulting from hardness of heart toward God's messengers, the prophets. New life with Christ, life with access to divine grace, we do not (nor should we) experience our hardships as punishments, but rather they become opportunities for us to live a radically different life, they allow for the "power of Christ to dwell in us" and actually lead us to be more intimate with God.

We still might say, 'that's nice and all, but it still doesn't seem like a compelling option I would choose.' Consider also that St. Paul *continually* grew and was renewed in intimacy with the Lord the more he was aware of his weakness and vulnerability. Precisely in these places were spaces where only the Lord himself could touch,

heal, transform, and perform mighty and unexpected deeds. We might even posit that without his thorn in the flesh, St. Paul doesn't continue to deepen his commitment to evangelization, or that he might've lost his incessant ability to go through struggles for love of the Lord and the Gospel. Consider that after 'would-be' loss the many early Christian communities of changed hearts might not have been born, and by connection, new disciples would then cease to change the world. We know confidently though that it was through the hardship, the Lord truly expanded Paul's ability to become like Himself, to suffer in love just as Jesus did for us. Paul had a deep, deep capacity for divine love. Even those of us who have worked diligently or fought long and hard for something, or who have lived well their vocations in providing for families for example, would likely look back and say, "I truly have grown and been transformed through all the sacrifices. I wouldn't change it."

So while we might be more interested in questioning the wisdom of God that he would permit hardships in our life, let us fix our eyes of faith on Him who loved us so to suffer for us, so that our suffering is never in vain. Maybe our ability to suffer well changes when we receive the reality that in mercy, God doesn't abandon but now protects us through the hardships so that we might come to trust Him in ways we never thought was possible for us. Today, may we all be granted an increase of faith, that with our hearts opened toward the Lord in the midst of our trials, Jesus may 'perform mighty deeds' in us and for us, and free us to move speedily with Him from the cross to resurrected life.

## Centennial Corner



As the US made it out of the depression and the war ended, we began to feel that security again. We established many great traditions and organizations that would go onto serve the church and the community over the next 60 years. As we entered into the 1940s a thorough instruction program was established for students in public grammar school, junior high school, and high school—in 1940 as a result of a new state law that allowed public school students to be released from class for one hour each week for spiritual instruction.
