A Message from the Pastor

Oftentimes people accuse us as Catholics as just having a lot of “rules,”--and in fairness sometimes we as Catholics sometimes *live* our lives as disciples just exteriorly following rules or observance after observance without ever putting much heart or thought into why it is that we do the things we do. Our readings today though are quite important for our consideration, because we have to be challenged in our understanding of how we approach our moral lives. And so, certainly an obvious theme across the readings today is the “Law of the Lord” and our response to it. We will probably cringe a little bit, or feel some discomfort thinking about the subject, because it’s a little easier for us to imagine a loosey-goosey Jesus, or a laid back Jesus who just says nice things and loves all and...well, you know what I mean!

Jesus has no desire though, as we hear proclaimed today, to water anything down. In fact, he does quite the opposite. First he teaches that he has come “*not* to abolish the law and prophets, but rather to *fulfill* them” (cf. Mt. 5:17). Meaning he’s not doing away with what was asked of the Lord’s covenant people of old, but instead he’s elevating and getting even more to the heart of what the law and the prophets established. Case and point, as we hear, it’s not simply enough to “not kill someone” but rather even to harbor anger in our hearts towards another, this is a danger to us. One’s permanence of commitment in marriage is more than just refraining from being with any other person besides your spouse, but more so not even *looking* at another in lust or an objectifying kind of way--this is a danger even if one never acts on such desires! Jesus upholds and even calls us to a higher level of love than what was merely written in the law--and yes, this is not easy, and yes, Jesus knows that.

Our reading from the book of Sirach pays attention to the reality that you and I have freedom to choose whether or not we respond to the life that the Lord calls us to (or not). God doesn’t give anyone “license to sin” and in freedom he places before us the opportunity to come to know true life, and true relationship. Sin is our freely choosing to live against how the Lord calls us in relationship with him, with our neighbor, with ourselves. Sin has a splintering effect on our hearts and souls, it quite literally disintegrates us, and so we would (and should) expect the Lord to be firm in his desire to protect us and prevent us from falling into sin. How do we follow through on this difficult and narrow road? So often we have the desire and intention to live the Gospel and so many times we fall short. Let’s not be discouraged.

We can find encouragement and motivation from the catechism that rightly observes Jesus himself (as he is the *fulfillment* of the law and prophets) is **the only one who could keep [the law] perfectly (CCC 578)**. It is not in our human power alone to be able to live the perfection of the life of discipleship. However! This cannot be our excuse. Jesus himself desires to pour out the Holy Spirit upon us that makes the life of discipleship POSSIBLE. It is *his* life alive in us that makes us able to live the commandments of the Lord, to live the high level of love that we are called to. So if we are struggling to live a particular law of charity of the Gospel, we must ask and invoke the Holy Spirit to assist us...Jesus will not withhold his grace from the heart that seeks to be united to His. May we trust anew this day that the law of the Lord leads us to life, saves us from sin, and fills us with joy!

Walking with Moms in Need

We are so very excited about launching our new ministry to support families in need in our parish and in our local community. As you may recall, *Walking with Moms in Need* is an initiative of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) that began roughly 5 years ago. An important effort to continue allowing the Church to be directly accompanying those who courageously choose life and need support in providing for the basic needs of their children.

We had the privilege recently of visiting the only other local operation of this ministry in our Diocese which is out in Fulton, NY, where Fr. Scradella and his parishioners responded to the call about this time last year to give a home to *Walking with Moms in Need* for their community. The impact of their outreach has been impressive, and even within just a few months of opening they have expanded and relocated on their campus to accommodate both the actual needs being met, and also the simultaneous tremendous generosity of the local parishes coming together in that region. In speaking with the volunteers there, they have expressed their belief that our outreach will likely serve a population even greater in number, and have generously offered to be of whatever assistance we need as we begin this ministry.

Our goal is still to open our doors beginning the first week of March. Your incredible amount of donations have been organized and sorted, and construction is underway in the convent/office to make our space ready. (Be on the lookout for photos of the progress!) There is so much to be excited about! **If you are interested in becoming a volunteer to help operate the ministry, please contact the office.** We will be hosting a meeting before the end of February to help acclimate our volunteers. The tentative hours of operation, matching what works well in Fulton, is Tuesdays and Thursdays 10am-12pm. We, too, would like to be in continuity with them and name the ministry **Mary's Closet**. As the ministry continues to grow throughout our diocese, we hope that people will be able to recognize the important work of this unique outreach. Mary's Closet will, of course serve, not just moms, but also dads! And as our own parish bears a title of 'Our Lady' we know that our mother Mary will continue to keep us and all those who come to find encouragement and support through the life of our parish, safe and loved in her embrace, drawing us to the heart of her Son.

This project will be ongoing and will evolve in many ways, so please know your continued support through your time, talent and treasure will be a tremendous blessing for us. We are also deeply grateful for your support in prayer at this time! Continue to follow the bulletin for future updates.

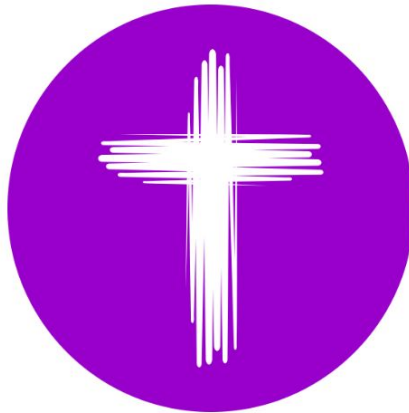
Magnificat

Lenten Season - Please join us!

- **Ash Wednesday:** February 18th, Ash Wednesday, marks the beginning of the Season of Lent. The Church gives us Lent as a time to change, to become a better version of ourselves, and to become more like Jesus. The ashes we receive on Ash Wednesday remind us of our call to repent and believe in the Gospel. The disciplines of Lent—prayer, fasting, and almsgiving—help us prepare for Christ's victory on Easter. When receiving ashes, we hear the words, "Remember that you are dust and dust you shall return," or "Turn away from sin and believe in the Gospel" to bring us into a penitential disposition.
- **Holy Hour:** Tuesdays evenings join at the Convent at Pompei for Holy Hour, Eucharistic Adoration, Fr. Foley will also lead some quiet praise and worship music as has been the case when we do this! After the time of prayer, a program will be offered journeying through the book, now spiritual classic, "He Leadeth Me" by Fr. Walter Ciszek. Books will be available through Fr. Foley, or you can obtain yourself, but also you are welcome to **participate even if you don't want to read the book!** Each week a few chapters will be covered, and together we will be transformed by Fr. Walter's amazing and powerful testimony. Adoration will start at 5:30 in the chapel, the talks/class will follow at 6:30/6:45pm. Please feel welcome to join even if you can't make it every week.
- **Eucharistic Adoration** will be offered during the regularly scheduled hour of confession at both OLP/SP (W 4-5pm) and St. JtB/HT (Th 4-5pm). We hope to continue this even after Lent! Please come and rest with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament!
- **Stations of the Cross:** Every Friday at St. John the Baptist at 4pm (and led by volunteers prior to the 9am Mass) And at Pompei we will designate Saturday March 7th, and Saturday March 28th to be days where **following the 4pm Mass** we will invite all to stay after Mass to pray the Stations.
