
First Sunday in Advent





Dear Parishioners,

This weekend we begin our observance of Advent, one of the most beautiful seasons of the year. For me, much of its beauty comes from the fact that it approaches the next few weeks in such a different way than the world around us does. The secular world is already decorated for Christmas; in fact, much of the world is already celebrating Christmas. We, however, as a Catholic Christian community have just begun to prepare. While the outside world is being overwhelmed with the commercialism of the "shopping season", we are called to prayerfully prepare for the coming of Christ.

Because society jumps right into Christmas after Thanksgiving (for some, Halloween), we are often in danger of losing sight of the true nature of the Advent season. This is a time of joyful anticipation of the coming of Christ, not just as a babe in Bethlehem, but also for His coming at the end of time. I realize that we all have to take some time to prepare for the physical celebration of Christmas, but I also hope and pray that we all take time to spiritually prepare during this Advent season. Without this spiritual preparation, all the shopping, wrapping, baking, decorating, etc., is ultimately worthless because it is not a reflection of the joy we should have at the coming of the Prince of Peace.

Next Sunday, December 8th, Bishop Lucia will be awarding the Immaculata Award. This award was instituted in celebration of the 125th Anniversary of the Diocese of Syracuse. The award is given to a layperson from each parish who generously and unselfishly volunteers time and service to their parish. I am pleased to announce that this year's recipients of the Immaculata Award from Our Lady of Pompei/St. Peter's are Eric & Colleen Rosenthal. Colleen & Eric are dependable volunteers in the parish and are involved in many aspects of parish life, especially involving the youth and our parish school. They are truly a blessing to the parish and I am extremely pleased that the Bishop is recognizing the great contribution they make to our community.

As we begin our Advent journey, I assure you of my continued prayers for all of you; please keep me in your prayers.

St. Nicholas was a bishop who lived in the 4th century in Myra in Asia Minor which is now Turkey. He was a very rich and very kind man who had the reputation for helping the poor and giving secret gifts to people in need. Because of his kindness, Nicholas was made a Saint. He is the patron saint of children and sailors. December 6th is St. Nicholas Day.

The story goes that he helped some sailors caught in a terrible storm off the coast of Turkey. The men were terrified that their ship would sink. They prayed to him for help; suddenly he was standing on the ship. He ordered the sea to be calm and the storm died down and the sailors were able to sail their ship.

St. Nicholas was exiled from Myra and later put in prison during the persecution by the Emperor Diodetian. He died on the 6th of December in either 345 or 352 AD. His bones were stolen from Turkey in 1807 by Italian merchant sailors and are kept in the Church named after him in Bari, Italy.

On St. Nicholas Day the sailors of Bari still carry his statue from the Cathedral out to sea, so that he can bless the waters and give them safe voyages throughout the year. A tradition on this day was to put their shoes out the night before so they could receive treats if they were good. If they were bad they would receive lumps of coal.



The Giving Trees

The Annual Giving Trees have been set up in Church. We ask that parishioners pick up a tag (or two) from the Giving Trees.

The tags will indicate the item needed to be purchased. The gifts will be given to local organizations for distribution. It is important that all gifts are placed under the trees by **December 14/15th** at the very latest. Let's have 100% participation in making this a truly special time for those who are less fortunate. For an easier distribution, please only use gift bags—no boxes or wrapped gifts. You may attach the tag to the item, not the gift bag.

Parish Offices 2 months in advance so that your envelopes can be stopped until your return to the area, then we can reactivate the mailings.
