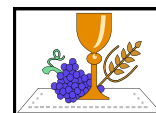

**Census 2020 Information**

**What is At Stake for Our Communities?** Our community benefits from everyone being counted and we have one chance in a decade to get it right. The 2020 Census' impact on our communities is profound. It shapes everything from whether we have fair political representation in Congress to whether our roads, hospitals, schools and fire departments have the funding they need to support our health and well-being for the next decade. A full, accurate count lays the foundation for a healthy democracy and communities where families thrive and flourish. Your census information is confidential and we have a legal and moral responsibility to take part.

**Federal Funding:** Over \$800 billion in federal government funding will be determined by the 2020 Census count. The 2020 Census will impact how many teachers are hired in our local schools and how many nurses and beds are in our local hospitals. From roads to food assistance, when people are not counted, our communities lose out.

**Political Power:** The 2020 Census will determine how many representatives your state will send to Congress and how your congressional district will be drawn. State and local governments also use Census data to redraw state legislative districts. In the last Census New York lost 2 Congressional seats!
