The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend we celebrate the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi). What a wonderful time to resume the public celebration The Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. This will be the first weekend in three months that we have been able to gather to celebrate the Eucharist in our two parishes. I know that not being able to receive the Body and Blood of the Lord has been a great burden on so many members of our community. I also realize that some members of the community are not in a position to come back to Mass at the present time. However, I believe that this a good time for all of us to stop and reflect on the precious gift of the Eucharist that the Lord has left His Church. It would be terrible if, after longing for the Eucharist for months, we fell back into our former attitudes towards this remarkable gift the Lord has given us.

We are called to be the Body of Christ in the world and we remain faithful to our calling by receiving the very Body and Blood of Christ in the Eucharist. The Eucharist is the greatest prayer of the Church and it should be considered a great privilege to be able to gather each Sunday to celebrate Mass. We must remember that our strength as a community is found in the Eucharist; when we receive Holy Communion, we are not receiving bread and wine, but rather, the very Body and Blood of our Precious Lord. Too often we recognize this spiritual reality with our minds, but fail to live it in our actions. It is my prayer that at this time in history, as we are confronted with great changes, the Eucharist will help us to give witness to and be an agent of transformation for, the world around us. May we always be aware of the great gift of the Eucharist and our call to be a Eucharistic people.

For those who are not going to be able to join us in person for Mass, I encourage you to join us through our live-streamed celebration or to watch a televised celebration of Mass. If you will not be receiving the Holy Eucharist, I encourage you to make the following Act of Spiritual Communion from St. Alphonsus Liguori:

My Jesus, I believe that you are present in the most Blessed Sacrament. I love You above all things and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot now receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there, and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen.

Please know that you are in my prayers; please keep me in yours.
