A Message from the Pastor

Today the Church observes the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul-a feast that is every June 29. We might look at these apostles and think we could never have anything in common with them, nor is it likely to be able to imitate their faith and perseverance. However, we are called to stand on their foundation! We honor them today not because of their own merits, but rather because in their humility and docility of heart, they allowed the grace of Jesus to be their all even above their own sinfulness and imperfections—the accomplishments we look to in their lives is rather the fruit of the Holy Spirit's mission, and reminds us of Jesus' own words at the last supper: "...apart from me, you can do nothing" (Jn 15:5).

Sometimes among our separated brothers and sisters in Protestant communities, there is an effort to separate St. Peter and St. Paul, that there was division or conflict between them and that there was a distinction in the Gospel they insisted on preaching to the world. This really has no merit, and scripturally we can see why the opposite is true and why it would be important for us to continue upholding these two apostles as being tremendous instruments for the Lord and his Church as two sides of the same coin. Ancient art will very often depict the two in an embrace, together. Together they gave witness by shedding their blood so that Jesus would come to be known and loved to the ends of the earth for all time. Their lives provide us the inseparable gifts of unity and evangelization.

St. Peter, always depicted with primacy and with the keys of the kingdom, reminds us of leadership, governance, law, authority, and direction. It also represents structure, unity, order, and complex decision-making (especially as we hear in the Gospel today about Jesus bestowing on him the power of "binding and loosing"). The symbol of a key provides some important insights, too. A flimsy, soft, and misshapen key can only partially function. It will not achieve its end: opening and closing a door. Like a strong key, the Church must be firm, solid, and properly structured. This type of key achieves its end when opening and closing a door.

Paul is most often depicted holding a sword. Of course, Paul was martyred in Rome by the sword, yes, but like a sword, Paul's words pierced the Roman Empire much more deeply than the Roman guards could ever pierce his skin. Paul's letters to various communities and his preaching changed the landscape of Western civilization. So with the sword Paul reminds us of evangelization, preaching, teaching, writing, catechesis, missionary work, transforming the culture, and dialoguing with various groups. Evangelization must pierce cultural perceptions, understandings, and opinions like the sword. The sword of evangelization must cut through the superficial and erroneous aspects of the culture.

With these features of their discipleship, we can see why it is crucial for us to celebrate them together. If we only ever emphasize the evangelization of St. Paul, we risk losing the integrity of the unity of the body, the structure that holds everything together. If we only ever prioritize the integrity of the structure and institution and the body, we neglect the mission to bear the gospel to the world. When we hold the invitation from St. Peter and St. Paul together, we realize the incredibly daunting, difficult, yet nonetheless vital task before us always: unity and evangelization, drawing others to Jesus Christ the Lord. And how encouraging for us that Jesus himself chose these imperfect, sinful men to be foundational instruments for his mission! St. Peter time and again failed Jesus, and would have lived the rest of his life with the memory of having denied Jesus in his hour of need. St. Paul had fought and had even consented to the murder of Christians and persecuted the early Church. If Jesus would mercifully break into their lives to offer them his healing, his light, his truth, his Gospel, and use their gifts and hearts for the building up of his body, what does it say about what Jesus can do and wants to do in our own lives as his disciples? None of us are beyond the hope of transformative grace, none of us are forgotten nor overlooked by God, if the Lord used Peter and Paul as instruments of unity and evangelization, what will he do with you?! May Ss. Peter and Paul pray for us this day that we too be rescued by the love of God and may we respond anew to the call to be disciples!
