A Message from the Pastor

Last Sunday, St. Paul's challenge in the letter to the Romans was to "awaken from sleep" and to recognize the reality of the Lord's presence already alive and available to them as disciples *now* even as they anticipated with confidence the Lord's final coming in glory. Yes--we are likely aware of ourselves that we also could be more attentive to this reality, too, especially if we don't often take stock of the larger scope of our lives on earth and the time and gifts that have been entrusted to us. A favorite spiritual author of mine, Fr. Jacques Philippe reminds us simply, "The Lord is **always** coming, but we are not always ready to receive Him. The essential work of the spiritual life is to keep our hearts open and free so that Jesus can enter." And so enter our season of Advent. These days give us pause, they call us to again prepare for the final day of the Lord, to return to the healing mercy of the Sacrament of Reconciliation, and to help us fix our gaze or reorient us toward the things that ultimately will endure. And truly we know ourselves, we know that we get distracted or busy, even with good intentions, and so the humble invitation from the Church during these brief days and weeks to us is, let Advent be Advent.

We should strive to respond to the invitation to be still, precisely stillness with the Lord. Our time of intentional entering into silence and prayer is not to force ourselves into an abyss of emptiness or isolation from the cares of the world, but rather to be with the One who alone offers us refuge and strength to then go and engage the various tasks and callings we have received. Fr. Jacques continues, "Peace of heart does not consist in having no more difficulties, but [rather] in waiting for God to act with confidence and love [as our steadfast posture]. It is the attitude of a child who knows he is loved and who waits for everything from his father." And this kind of genuine trust and confidence is precisely what St. Paul wanted to awaken in his fellow disciples. Something changes deeply within us when we live in greater awareness of the closeness of the Lord's presence, or as he described last Sunday, that the reality in which we now live is that salvation is closer to us than when we first believed. One of the many fruits of abiding always in this kind of trust is the unfathomable 'harmony' that St. Paul describes today in our second reading (Romans 15:4-9).

Enter today one of our pivotal Advent figures, St. John the Baptist, who also boldly proclaims this reality of the closeness of the Lord in our Gospel today: "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand!" is what he announces. Hidden in the original Greek for "at hand" is "has drawn near" or more literally "has arrived." So John, like Paul, shakes us with an urgency that the Lord is nearer to us than we realize or have previously recognized. What changes for us in our lives if we become more attentive to the reality of the Lord's constantly "drawing near"? What are the things in our life that form obstacles that make it difficult to recognize the subtlety of his presence? **Now is the time** to make changes in our life that would lend to us recognizing more readily the desire of the Lord to maintain communion with us or offer the sweetness of his harmony with us. Thanks be to God, the constant invitation to be cleansed of the things we substitute for the Lord can be made actualized in the mercy we receive in the Sacrament of Confession--not something to be feared or ashamed of, but to be acknowledged with joy. If we humbly go before the Lord there acknowledging, yes, there are ways that I allow my heart and mind to be filled with distractions that keep me from recognizing the generous closeness of the Lord at all times (even in difficulty, grief, or illness, etc.) day by day I will gain the freedom of heart to understand the distinct urgency of St. John and St. Paul.

This is simply what I am suggesting in saying "Let Advent *be* Advent" for us. If we simply observe what the season draws forth from us, we will learn what it looks like to abide continually in a hope-filled posture of anticipation that the Lord is coming *always*, and will ultimately come again at the end of all things. Doing so, the Lord will gently remove fear and anxiety from our hearts and in their place he will restore the strength and confidence of his presence. Let's strive to better allow this work of grace to come to fulfillment in our hearts in these Advent days so that we may be moved with gratitude and overcome by the generosity of the Lord who takes the initiative to come to us and make his presence known.



Walking with Moms

We've been invited as a parish family to consider beginning a new outreach ministry to the Northside that coincides with an effort that began in dioceses around the country about 5 years ago. We know how important it is for us as the Church to continue pouring out mercy for all those who find themselves in need, and this opportunity allows us to help meet a unique need that will have a tremendously positive impact on our neighborhood and even within families in our parish. Certainly a vulnerable population in need are mothers or fathers striving to provide for their children, especially those facing unexpected pregnancies.

"Walking with Moms in Need is a nationwide, parish-based initiative to increase support for pregnant and parenting mothers in need. It works to ensure that any woman who finds herself unexpectedly pregnant, or parenting in difficult circumstances, can turn to her local Catholic Church and be connected with the resources she needs. Volunteers walk with moms throughout the motherhood journey, offering them authentic Christian friendship and ongoing support."

It is our goal to begin this ministry in the coming weeks, and as part of our annual "Giving-Tree" we will invite the opportunity to stock this new ministry and begin meeting needs immediately! Volunteers will be needed to help organize donations in the parish office as well as offering different windows of time (TBD) to receive family referrals and distribute donations accordingly. Effectively this ministry operates as a way of providing necessities like diapers, wipes, clothing, bottles, etc--that would not normally be available at food pantries, to those who are in great need. We anticipate this as being another way that the parishes in the Northside can collaborate, as well as opportunities for student groups from our Catholic Schools to sponsor as well.

Our friends in Fulton with Fr. Scardella began this ministry and have titled their outreach as "Mary's Closet" and it has been a blessing for many, and also a way of entrusting Mary's motherly care to those in need of her tenderness. We may join them in sharing that name, but are still prayerfully discerning that! Until then, we are excited to begin this new work of mercy as a parish family.
