A Message from the Pastor

Hope's Gentle Embrace: Lifting Our Hearts to God. Most of us have probably felt at one time or another a time when we were so fatigued that our bodies had nearly zero energy to move a muscle, a different kind of exhaustion that we are powerless against, that it would literally take the generosity of a selfless friend to keep you upright. It's not a comfortable experience, I suppose it could be discouraging or maybe even humiliating to be that dependent on another. But in these spaces of trust and surrender, what an uplifting movement of the heart to experience when we receive that loving rescue from outside of ourselves. Amazing to envision the story of our first reading from the book of Exodus. It's a powerful story of hope and deliverance. We see Moses atop a hill, his arms raised intently in prayer as the people of Israel battles Amalek below. When weariness weighs on him, Aaron and Hur gently support his hands, ensuring victory through their quiet solidarity. This image communicates to us: hope is not a solitary endeavor but a shared journey, sustained by God's unfailing presence and the love of those around us, especially through the Church.

Psalm 121 lifts our gaze even further, singing, "I lift up my eyes to the mountains; from where shall come my help? My help is from the Lord, who made heaven and earth" (Ps 121:1-2). Our God, who "neither slumbers nor sleeps" (Ps 121:4), watches over us with a love that never falters. In moments of struggle—whether personal doubts, family challenges, or the world's unrest—this psalm offers a gentle promise: the Lord guards our every step, now and always. It is his deep desire not to shy away from us in the struggle of life, but rather to carry us through, and to sustain us beyond our ability to see. How does our confidence to face the difficulties of life grow when we remember we are backed by the confidence and this assurance of the Lord's fidelity?

Pope Benedict XVI, in Spe Salvi, speaks to this hope with luminous clarity: "The one who has hope lives differently" (Spe Salvi, 2). He reminds us that Christian hope is "a trusting expectation of God's help" (Spe Salvi, 34), rooted in Christ's victory over death. This hope transforms our hearts, inviting us to live with joy and courage, even in trial. "In hope we were saved... it is the expectation of things to come from the perspective of a present that **is already given**" (Spe Salvi, 7, emphasis added). Through prayer, like Moses, we can touch eternity now, trusting God's nearness. It's not a question of whether salvation has been won or whether the life of heaven exists, but rather it is something so firm that should indeed build our life now, as our souls and our very beings are transformed by the life of heaven hidden in the sacraments.

This is the special fruit of living deeply rooted in the Sacramental life of the Church. The Lord offers us something so extraordinary through the humble means of the life of grace. When have you felt God's quiet strength in weariness? Have you considered that your participation at Mass each Sunday is the vehicle by which the Lord is making you like himself? Or that the Lord is making the generosity and strength of your heart as coming each day to match his own? Who has been your Aaron or Hur, lifting you through prayer or kindness? How can you, in turn, hold up another's heart? Begin simply: Consider reclaiming psalm 121 as you begin each day. Traditionally this was the very first psalm prayed with a newborn baby, recognizing that as new life begins in the Lord, one receives the unfathomable gift of knowing the assurance of God's assistance all life long. As Benedict writes, "Hope does not disappoint, because God's love has been poured into our hearts" (Spe Salvi, 1). In the Eucharist today, let the power of God's divine love renew and strengthen you for continuing to engage the struggle that you may especially come to know Christ's own victory. With Mary, our Mother of Hope, we ask for the grace to lift our eyes to the mountains with confidence and gratitude.. The Lord, who in his goodness chooses to walk with you, turn your every step into a song of trust and joy.

All Souls Day--November 2, 2025!

The day in the liturgical calendar when we pause with solemnity with the Catholic Church throughout the world for heightened remembrance of the faithful departed. This year, November 2nd is a Sunday. When this feast falls on a Sunday it is observed as our primary Sunday celebration. To do this with greater solemnity this year, we will have our usual remembrance of those who have gone home to the Lord since November 2nd, 2024, but we would also like to invite you to remember the other deceased members of your families and friends as well.

We plan to offer you the opportunity to obtain a candle, which we will label with the names of your deceased loved ones, and line our side altars (with our Saints), with these candles.

Our faith is founded on our confidence in the Resurrection, and while we grieve the loss of our loved ones, we are encouraged to remember them and intercede for them that they may now enjoy the fullness of life in heaven.
