A Message from the Pastor

Catechism of the Catholic Church #683: **"To be in touch with Christ, we must first have been touched by the** Holy Spirit. He comes to meet us and kindles faith in us."

From the preface at Mass today: "For bringing your Paschal Mystery to completion, you bestowed the Holy Spirit today on those you made your adopted children by uniting them to your Only Begotten Son. **This same Spirit, as the Church came to birth**, <u>opened to all peoples the knowledge of God</u> and brought together many languages of the earth

in profession of the one faith..."

Pentecost Sunday recalls an incredible and pivotal moment for the life of the Church and for us as members of the body of Christ-we must not miss it. Over the past several Sundays we've been receiving the consolation and encouragement from Jesus' words that remind us of his assurance to remain with us always, through the promised Holy Spirit that was to come. This is not something to be taken lightly, but really, the gift and activity of the Holy Spirit is precisely our foundation for even having a relationship with God, because it is the gift of God himself: *"Brothers and sisters: No one can say, 'Jesus is Lord,' except by the Holy Spirit" (1 Cor. 12:3b), "The Advocate, the Holy Spirit whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you" (John 14:26). The confidence of God's closeness to us all throughout our lives is only possible because of this promised gift that came to us in the moment of Pentecost. It is the ongoing desire of the heart of God to continue to pour his love into our hearts through the Holy Spirit (Romans 5:5). Why? Because only through the presence of God, the presence of the Holy Spirit, is it possible for us to intimately know God and to be transformed by such knowledge. This is pure gift! God in his goodness has revealed himself and has invited us to know him sincerely. How do we grow in knowledge of God? How do we come to receive more from this promised Holy Spirit?*

A little more from Scripture if you would permit me! In the Gospel of John, Jesus says, "Let anyone who is thirsty come to me, and let the one who believes in me drink. As the scripture has said, 'Out of the believer's heart shall flow rivers of living water.' Now he said this about the Spirit, which believers in him were to receive" (John 7:37-39) and "..whoever drinks the water I give them will never thirst. Indeed, the water I give them will become in them a spring of water welling up to eternal life. "(John 4:14) "...the Spirit too comes to the aid of our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but the Spirit itself intercedes with inexpressible groanings" (Romans 8:26) What should we make of all this? The Holy Spirit is the breath of God that gives us life at every second of our existence, and because of this goodness we are never left to journey our lives alone. Let's ask for the grace today that we be willing to be docile to this Spirit, that we might be greater disposed to trust and follow after wherever the Lord leads us, knowing that He is always leading us deeper in unity with him, for there is our surest refuge.

The connection of the Holy Spirit to the papacy begins with St. Peter, who was chosen by Jesus to be the leader of His followers and the first Pope. On Pentecost Sunday, the Holy Spirit descended upon the apostles, empowering them to boldly proclaim the Gospel and establish the Church. This event marked the beginning of the apostolic tradition, where the Holy Spirit continues to guide and inspire the successors of St. Peter through the ages. Each pope, including the current Pope Leo XIV, inherits this sacred mission, ensuring that the teachings of Christ and the unity of the Church remain vibrant and alive. As we approach the Jubilee of the Holy See on June 9th, we celebrate this unbroken line of leadership and the ongoing presence of the Holy Spirit in the life of the Church, affirming our faith in the continuity of apostolic authority from St. Peter to today.

Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created, and you shall renew the face of the earth. O God, who have taught the hearts of the faithful by the light of the Holy Spirit, grant that in the same Spirit we may be truly wise and ever rejoice in his consolation. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.


27th Annual Msgr. William J. Walsh Memorial Golf Tournament
