In response to last month's suggestions of other merchandise to add to our inventory, Ginny reported that preliminary results aren't promising for now. We would be ordering in somewhat small quantities, so prices will be high. Based on suggestions from our last meeting, she had quickly priced out those items, and here's what one online supplier offered:

- o Full-sized flags (\$84)
- o 3x5 flag (\$62)
- o 12 x 18 Garden flags (\$72)
- o Round hand fans (\$24.99 per 12 / ~\$2.00 each)
- o Windbreaker (pocket logo) (\$17-45) depending on style choice

The Board will look into this again once we find a reliable vendor, hopefully local, that we can work with consistently, and hope for better pricing. Pre-orders for some items might also be offered in the future. Anyone who knows of one, was asked to share that information with a board member.
