

## **VOLUNTEER HOURS**

What counts? What doesn't count? Man hours are simply the number of club members participating in an event times the number of hours in the event.

• For example: 25 club members march in a community Independence Day parade that lasts four

hours—25 members X 4 hours per member = 100-man hours.

- The time spent by club members to build a float for this parade should also be tracked. Attendance at a club hosted event does not count.
- If your club hosts a fundraising party, for example, with raffles, auctions, etc. and 300 people show up for the four-hour soiree, you cannot claim 1200 man hours, even through you raised money for a worthy cause.
- However, the dollars raised during the festivities may certainly be claimed as a charitable donation, as can any man hours spent in planning the function, setting up, tearing down, cleaning up, etc.

Expanding on that, here are some examples of things that count:

- Participating in a community event as a club:
  - o Parades
  - o Alzheimer's walks
  - o Cancer walks
  - o Assisting with nursing home or group home events or parties
  - o Collections of toys, time spent gift wrapping for groups, delivery time
  - o Roadside clean-up
  - o Planning club events:
  - o Planning meetings
    - Set up
    - \* Tear down/Clean up
    - Seeking Sponsorship
    - \* Time spent seeking sponsors for club events
    - \* Time spent seeking donations from businesses for club events

## Examples of things that **do not** count:

- Attending club events going to Happy Hours or attending a club sponsored event
- · Individual members volunteering at non-club sanctioned activities
- Monetizing volunteer hours
