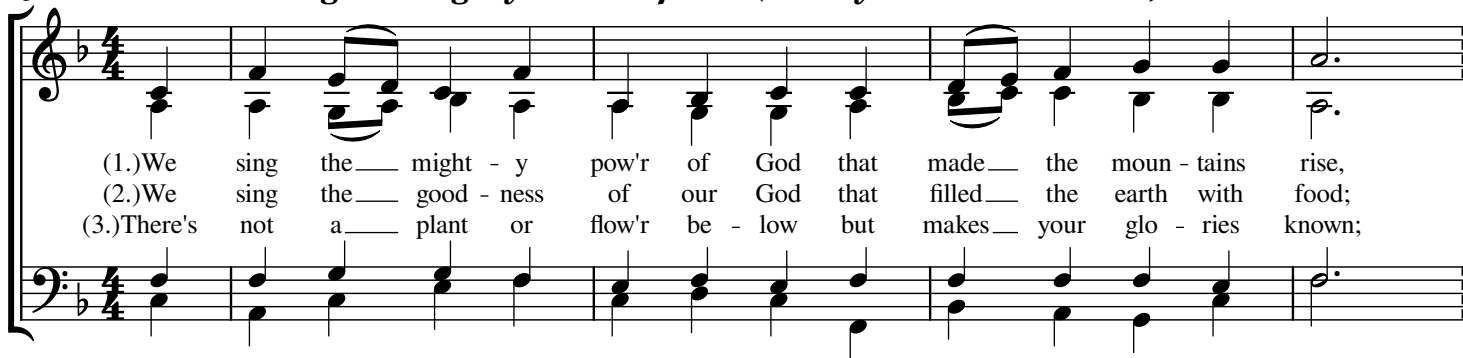

(3.)"Ho - san - na\_ in the high - est!" That an - cient song we sing,

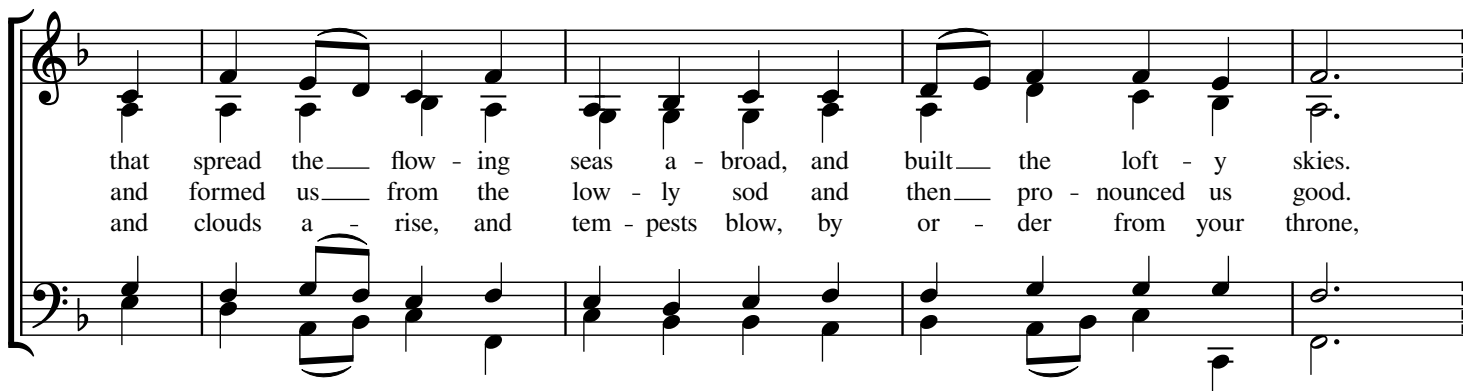
through pil - lared\_ court and tem - ple the love - ly an - them rang.
