## PRAYER WARRIORS

This month's unsung heroes represent a large yet obscure group of saints. Though they may not serve on a committee or teach a class; and their name may never appear in the church bulletin; this group represents the ultimate act of servitude within our church. For they are the faithful prayer warriors who lift prayer requests up daily.

It has been quoted that ""Intercessory prayer is the highest work of love. It is the greatest act of faith." (Anonymous) You can be sure the unseen and unsung heroes would never consider themselves "great."

Too often, they may even downplay their immensely important labor of love. Perhaps circumstances prevent them from attending church, and we may not see their faces on a regular basis. But their presence is most prevalent.. As James confirms, "The effective, fervent prayer of a righteous man avails much." (James 5:16)

Communication with our Sovereign Creator is not only an undeserved privilege; it is our most effectual form of communicating with our King

People often say, "Well, all I can do is pray." The Truth remains that prayer represents the most powerful act of faith any of us can put into practice! Prayer demonstrates obedience to our Savior's greatest commandments, spoken in Matthew 22:37-40: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind," and "Love your neighbor as yourself." Charles Bent commented that:

"Intercessory prayer might be defined as loving our neighbor on our knees." One of the most intimate demonstrations of love is prayerful invention. These servants rejoice with those who rejoice. They mourn with those who mourn. They have a spirit of thanksgiving when God moves among His people. These prayer warriors have a heart for God, a heart for prayer, a heart for people, and a heart for the body of Christ. They trust totally, they support supremely, they love lavishly, and they serve sacrificially. In other words, they live and pray the Jesus Way!

The good news about this "select" group is - every follower of Christ can and should share in this ministry. As Oswald Chambers so eloquently states: "The real business of your life as a saved soul is intercessory prayer." There is no mandated committee, and you will not be voted on in a business meeting. The only One Who holds you accountable is our Perfect Father, and He is most forgiving. You can perform your duties in the comfort of your own home. You can establish your own hours. But make no mistake - powerful prayer requires self-sacrifice. This is a time-consuming responsibility. Walking in close communion with God remains essential for productive prayer. We must meditate on His law day and night so that we can observe to do according to all that is written therein.

Certain criteria contribute to an effective prayer life. A fundamental prerequisite is establishing a personal and meaningful connection with Jesus Christ. You must also approach His throne of grace with humility, with perseverance, with gratitude, and above all – with faith. Prayer represents dependence on, submission to, and trust in our Sovereign Lord. Paul says we are to pray without ceasing. Charles Spurgeon says, "Intercessory prayer is an act of communion with Christ, for Jesus pleads for the sons of men." Our church family is blessed with many unsung heroes of prayer. We will probably never realize the impact of their sacrificial service. When we witness the movement of God's Holy Spirit within our midst, and mountains move;

we can rest assured that somebody prayed!
