"Salvation Belongs To The LORD!"

"But I with the voice of thanksgiving will sacrifice to you; what I have vowed I will pay. Salvation belongs to the LORD!" (Jonah 2:9)

The prophet Jonah's situation was unique... I don't think any of us have ever spent three days or three nights in the belly of a fish. I do believe however there might be some that have spent three days and three nights with fish in their belly. Especially if it was fried catfish. But when we slow down and think of Jonah's trying time it must have been quite the experience...

For Salvation belongs to the LORD!!!
