Who or What is the Angel of YHWH?

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References to the Angel of YHWH can be classified as:

- 1. The angel is identified with YHWH they are one and the same, the angel is manifestation of YHWH.
- 2. The angel is an independent entity with a particular mission from YHWH.
- 3. Non-deterministic could be either of the above.

I. Patriarchal Period

God spoke freely to the Patriarchs:

- **Noah:** Gn6:13-21 instructions to build the ark; Gn7:1-5 instructions on animals to take; Gn9:1-16 the everlasting covenant
- **Abraham:** Gn12:1-3 instructions to leave Haran; Gn13:14-17 promise of inheritance of the land of Canaan; Gn15:1-20 the covenant ceremony (note vs1 'in a vision'); Gn17:1-14 confirmation of the covenant; Gn17:15-22 promise of Isaac

Hagar Incidents (Gn16:1-14, 21:8-19):

- Gn16:1-6 Hagar becomes pregnant, so Sarai sends her away
- Gn16:7-13 Hagar is rescued in the wilderness: note 'the angel of YHWH' in verses 7, 9, 10, 11 speaks with Hagar; then, verse 11 'YHWH has listened' and verse 13 'YHWH who spoke to her' Hagar seems to identify the 'angel of YHWH' with 'YHWH' himself, i.e., the angel is a manifestation of YHWH so that he can deal with a human being.
- Gn21:8-14 Isaac has been born; Sarah becomes jealous of Ishmael; so, requires Abraham to send away Hagar and Ishmael
- Gn21:15-19 Hagar and Ishmael are rescued: note verse 17 'God heard' but 'the angel of God' speaks with Hagar; v18 'I will make ...' the angel speaks on God's behalf; v19 'God opened her eyes' again the 'angel' appears to be a manifestation of God so that he can deal with a human being.

Prelude to Sodom and Gomorrah (Gn18:1-17):

- 18:1 'YHWH appeared'; verse 2 three 'men' are there one of whom is YHWH manifested as a 'man'; Abraham knows it is YHWH v3 calls him 'Adonai' (lord, master), Abraham calls himself his 'servant' in v3 and v5; 'YHWH said' v10, v13, and v17; v14 YHWH refers to himself as 'YHWH'
- Clearly, this is YHWH manifested as a man freely interacting with Abraham with no attempt at secrecy.

Sacrifice of Isaac (Gn22:1-16):

- 22:1 'God tested Abraham and said to him'; v11 'the angel of YHWH called ...' saying v12 '... you have not withheld your son ... from <u>me</u>'; v14 Abraham says 'YHWH will provide'; v15 'the angel of YHWH called' then v16 'By myself ... declares YHWH'
- Clearly, the 'angel of YHWH' and YHWH/God are one and the same a manifestation for a public situation.

Jacob Wrestles with God (Gn32:22-30):

- 32:24 'a man wrestled' and v25 'the man' as in Gn18, God/YHWH was manifested in human form; verse 28 'the man' changes Jacob's name to 'Israel' for 'you have striven with God'; v30 Jacob says 'I have seen God face to face'
- Hs12:3-4 Jacob 'strove with God ... he strove with the angel' Hosea identifies them as one and the same

II. The Mosaic Period

The Burning Bush (Ex3:1-13):

 3:2 'angel of YHWH' appears in the burning bush; v4 'God called', v6 'I am ... God' clearly God and the Angel of YHWH are one and the same; v7 'YHWH said'; v13 'Moses said to God' – the manifestation is to allow God to interact with a human being

- At7:30-34 Stephan recounting the incident says, 'an angel appeared' and the 'voice of the Lord: I am ...
 God'
- After this first encounter between YHWH and Moses, all through Exodus, Leviticus, and Numbers YHWH speaks freely with Moses as he did with the patriarchs.

The Pillar of Cloud and Fire:

- Ex13:21 'YHWH went before them in pillar of cloud ... and ... in a pillar of fire'; Ex14:19 'the angel of God ... the pillar of cloud ... stood behind'; v24 'YHWH in the pillar of fire and cloud'
- Ex23:20-21 'I send an angel before you ... my name is in him' (see also Gn32:29, Jdg13:18, Ex34:5); v23 'my angel goes before you ... to the Amorites (etc.) ... and I blot them out'
- Ex33:2-3 'I send an angel before you ... I will not go among you'; v9 'pillar of cloud would descend and ... he (YHWH) would speak with Moses'; v14 YHWH said, 'My presence ...' in the pillar, i.e. the angel of YHWH (Is63:9)
- Nm12:5-6 'YHWH ... in a pillar of cloud ... called ... hear my words'; Nm14:14 'O YHWH ... you go before them in a pillar of cloud ... and a pillar of fire'

The Theophany to Moses (Ex33:11-23, 34:1-9):

- 33:11 'YHWH use to speak to Moses face to face' via the pillar v9; Moses requests to 'see' YHWH v13 and v18
- 33:20 'you cannot see my face ... and live' hence, the necessity for YHWH to manifest himself in various forms to deal with human beings; v23 'you shall see my back'; 34:6 'YHWH passed before him ...'

Bile`am and his Donkey (Nm22:7-38):

- 22:7-21 the messengers present Balak's offer; note: YHWH/God speaks freely to Bile`am in private
- 22:22-23 along the way 'the angel of YHWH took his stand ... and the donkey saw ...'; v28 'YHWH opened the mouth of the Donkey; v31 'YHWH opened the eyes of Bile`am and he saw the angel of YHWH ...'; v35 '... the angel of YHWH said ... speak only the word <u>I</u> tell you'; v38 Bile`am says, '... the word that God puts in my mouth ...'

III. The Post-Mosaic Period

The Commander of YHWH's Army (Jsh5:13-15):

- 5:13 'a man standing' whom Joshua does NOT recognize 'Are you for us, or for our adversaries'
- 5:14 the 'man' reveals himself as 'commander of the army of YHWH', and Joshua worships him realizing he is YHWH

The Bochim Incident (Jdg2:1-5):

• 2:1 The 'angel of YHWH' appears to the whole congregation (v4), and speaks as YHWH 'I brought you up ...'; v2 'you have not obeyed my voice'

The commissioning of Gideon (Jdg6:11-23)

- 6:11-12 '... Gideon was beating out wheat ... the angel of YHWH appeared and said ...'; v14 'YHWH ... said ... do I not send you?' v16 'YHWH said to him ...'
- Gideon is not sure who it is, v13 '... YHWH has forsaken us ...', v17 '...show me a sign that it is you who speak with me.'
- 6:19-20 Gideon prepares an offering; v20 'the angel of God said ...', v21 'the angel of YHWH reached out [his] staff ... and consumed the [offering] ... and vanished ...', v22 'Then Gideon perceived that it was the angel of YHWH. Gideon said ... Adonai YHWH'

The Theophany to Manoah and his wife (Jdg13:2-25):

- 13:3 'the angel of YHWH appeared' to the wife of Manoah; v6 she calls him 'a man of God' with 'the appearance of the angel of God'
- 13:8 Manoah prays to see the 'man of God'; v9 God listens and sends 'the angel of God'; v10 'the man ... has appeared'; v13 'the angel of YHWH' speaks; v15 Manoah proposes an offering to the 'man'; who says, v16, 'offer it to YHWH' parenthetical statement affirms Manoah does not recognize 'the angel of YHWH'
- 13:19 Manoah offers a goat to YHWH; v20 'the angel of YHWH' disappears with the offering smoke; v21 they knew it was 'the angel of YHWH'; v22 Manoah fears death 'for we have seen God'

The Census of Israel (2Sm24:1-17, 1Chr21:1-17):

- 1Chr21:12 '...with the angel of YHWH destroying ...' v15 'God sent the angel ... YHWH saw ... and he said to the angel ...'
- 2Sm24:16 'the angel stretched out his hand ... YHWH relented ... and said to the angel ... it is enough ... the angel of YHWH was by the threshing floor ...'
- Here the angel of YHWH is clearly a distinct entity from YHWH

The Destruction of the Assyrian Army (2Kg19:32-35 // Is37:33-36, 2Chr32:21):

- 2Kg19:32, 34 '...thus says YHWH ... I will defend this city ... ', v35 '... that night the angel of YHWH ...' could be YHWH or a separate entity
- 2Chr32:21 '... YHWH sent an angel ... ' implies a separate entity

The final manifestation of YHWH – Jesus Christ (Zc2:8-11, 4:9, 6:15, Ml:3:1-2) [see Jh1:1, 1Cr10:4, Dt32:4]:

- Zc2:8-9 "I" and "me" are ambiguous the only reasonable antecedent is 'another angel' in v3; this angel speaks on behalf of YHWH in vs4-5; therefore, the most probable identity of this angel is the 'angel of YHWH'
- Zc2:10 '...I come and I will dwell in your midst, declares YHWH.' a prophecy of the first coming of the Messiah
- Zc2:11 "me" again ambiguous, but the only reasonable antecedent is the same as vs8-9 who is sent by YHWH and will "...dwell in your midst..." same as v10: unity of YWHW and the 'one sent'
- Zc4:9 and 6:15 again ambiguous "me" context is the Messiah 'the top stone' 4:7 (Ps118:22, Mt21:42) and 'Branch' 6:12
- MI3:1 "me" is YHWH (the LORD); the Lord (adon) is the Messiah who is YHWH

IV. Excursus: "man shall not see me and live" Ex33:20 [see Is57:15a, 1Cr15:50-53]

- Gn16:13 'I have seen him who looks after me' Hagar affirms she recognizes God in the angel of YHWH
- Gn32:30 'I have seen God face to face ...' Jacob affirms he recognizes God in the man with whom he wrestled
- Ex3:6 'Moses ... was afraid to look at God' Moses recognizes God in the burning bush (At7:32)
- Ex19:12 'Whoever touches the mountain ... put to death'; v18 'YHWH had descended ...'; v21 '... to look and many parish'; 20:19 '... do not let God speak to us least we die'
- Ex24:9-11 'Moses' and others '... saw the God of Israel ... they beheld God'; v17 'the appearance of the glory of YHWH was like a devouring fire ...'
- Dt5:24 '... YHWH ... has shown us his glory ... we have seen God speak with man, and man still live.'
- Jdg6:22-23 Gideon says, '...I have seen the angel of YHWH face to face...'; YHWH says '...you shall not die.'
- Jdg13:22 Manoah says, 'We shall surely die, for we have seen God.'
- Is6:5 Isaiah says, 'Woe is me! ... for my eyes have seen the King, the LORD of hosts.'
