The Firstborn Son

The Feast of Pentecost is integrally associated with the concepts of "<u>the firstborn son</u>" and "<u>firstfruits</u>". These concepts have a long history and very significant symbolic meaning. (Gn4:4, Ex13:1-2, 22:29b, 34:20bα, Rv1:4-5a)

<u>Holy Days and the Plan of God</u>: The "<u>harvest theme</u>" of the Holy Days was modelled around the agricultural cycle of ancient Israel – <u>symbolically, the theme looks to the "harvest" of human beings into the Family of God</u>. The Spring Holy Days look to the first resurrection: <u>Passover</u> – Jesus' death and Jesus' resurrection; <u>Feast of Unleavened Bread</u> – holiness, putting out sin and living by the Way of God; <u>Pentecost</u> – the Holy Spirit and "firstfruits".

<u>Rights of the Firstborn Son</u>: In ancient near eastern culture, <u>the firstborn male of animals and man was considered</u> <u>sacred</u>, i.e., animals were to be sacrificed and in Israel humans were to be "redeemed". Human sacrifice frequently took place (2Kg26a, 27a, 16:2-3, 2Chr33:1-2, 6a). <u>Esau was the "firstborn son"</u> of Isaac, therefore the "<u>birthright</u>" and "<u>blessing</u>" of Isaac belonged to him. Jacob legitimately purchased the "birthright" but he swindled the "blessing" (Gn25:29-33, 27:1-4, 18-19). Prior to entry into the Promised Land, Moses formalized the status of the "firstborn son" (Dt21:15-17, 25:5-6).

<u>The Firstborn of Egypt</u>: YHWH legitimized his removal of the Israelites from Egypt on the basis of the "firstborn son" (Ex4:22-23, 12:29-31). **By slaying the "firstborn" of Egypt to free Israel**, YHWH claimed the right to all the "firstborn" of Israel (Ex13:11-15).

<u>"Firstborn" and "Firstfruits"</u>: The "<u>firstborn son</u>" is also called the "<u>firstfruits</u>" (Gn49:3, Dt21:17). YHWH extended the consecration of "firstborn son" to include <u>"firstfruits" of produce</u> with the <u>"Feast of Harvest of firstfruits"</u> − Pentecost (Ex23:16a, 19a). The root verb, בְּבֹוֹר - <u>bakar</u>, means "to be born first"; it is seldom used. The masculine noun, בְּבֹוֹר - <u>bekor</u>, means "firstborn". The plural masculine noun, בְּבֹוֹר - <u>bikkurim</u>, means "firstfruits".

Symbolic Use of "Firstborn" and "Firstfruits": YHWH made it clear that his claim on the "firstborn" was symbolic – all the "firstborn" were redeemed by the tribe of Levi (Nm3:5-7, 12-13, 15, 40-41a). The Feast of Firstfruits of the harvest is associated with two "wave offerings" of firstfruits – the "waving motion" presents the offering before God which makes the waved object Holy for service to God (Lv23:10-11, 15-17, 20). The Levites were presented as a "wave offering" to make them holy to serve in the Tabernacle (Nm8:14-15). Jesus had to be presented before the Father (Jh20:17). Participants in the First Resurrection must be presented before God the Father in a covenant meal (Rv19:7-9a).

<u>Christ is the Firstborn</u>: "He is the image of the invisible God, <u>the firstborn of all creation</u>. ... He is the beginning, <u>the firstborn from the dead</u>, that in everything he might be preeminent. ... making peace by the blood of his cross" (Cl1:15-20) "Jesus Christ ... <u>the firstborn of the dead</u> ... who loves us and has freed us from our sins by his blood" (Rv1:4-6).

<u>True Worshippers are the Firstfruits</u>: "Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above ... that we should be a kind of <u>firstfruits</u> of his creatures" (Jm1:16-18). "Christ has been raised from the dead, the <u>firstfruits</u> of those who have fallen asleep ... Christ the <u>firstfruits</u>, then at his coming those who belong to Christ" (1Cr15:20-23). "... we ourselves, who have the <u>firstfruits</u> of the Spirit ... who are called according to his purpose ... to be conformed to the image of his Son, in order that he might be the <u>firstborn among many brothers</u>" (Rm8:19, 22-23,28-29). "God chose you as the <u>firstfruits</u> to be saved ... so that you may obtain the glory of our Lord Jesus Christ" (2Th2:13-14).

<u>Jesus Christ is the "firstborn son", the wave sheaf, the firstborn from the dead</u>. Through Jesus Christ all human beings can have their sins forgiven and have the opportunity to be part of the Family of God. <u>The Plan of God unfolds</u>: True Worshippers from the time Abel to the inception of the New Testament Church, and True Christians since then, are represented by <u>the two loaves of firstfruits waved on Pentecost</u> – they will participate in the First Resurrection. Jesus Christ was always Holy, yet he had to be presented before the Father after the resurrection; participants in the First Resurrection are presented before the Father in a covenant meal before returning to earth to <u>fulfill the Plan of God by bringing salvation to the rest of humanity</u>.
