What is "Prophecy"?

The primary purpose of the Old Testament prophets was to convict ancient Israel of its sins and bring the people back to true worship of God (2Kg17:13). Jesus affirmed that the main focus of predictive prophecy is his life and work (Lk24:44). The Apostle Paul asserts that all prophecy is trumped by "love" – everything else will pass away (1Cr13:8-10).

<u>The Nature of Prophecy</u>: there are two aspects to prophecy: <u>forthtelling</u> – teaching the Way of God; and, <u>foretelling</u> – predicting, stating what will happen in the future (Jr35:15, 17a, 34:21a). The fundamental role of a "prophet" is to <u>speak</u> <u>for God</u>: to relay the words of God to the intended hearers (Ex6:28-30, 7:1-2, 4:13-16).

**Foretelling**: The Creator God inhabits eternity; he exists outside of time and space as we can physically observe them; the physical universe is an object he can hold in his hand – <u>this allows God to determine what the future will be</u> (Is40:12, 46:9b-10, 11b). <u>Many instances of short-term foretelling</u> are recorded in the historical books of the Bible; mostly they are very specific and relate to current events as God was dealing with the nation of Israel (2Chr12:5, 9a). This kind of foretelling also occurred in the New Testament (At21:10-11).

<u>The Main Focus of Foretelling</u>: The writing prophets contain innumerable prophecies of <u>the life and work of the</u> <u>Messiah</u> – both the First Advent and the Second Advent (Mt1:18, 21-23, Is7:10-14, Jh6:43-48, Is54:1b, 5, 13). The <u>New</u> <u>Testament authors are unanimous</u> in applying Old Testament prophecies to the life and work of the Messiah, Jesus Christ (Mk1:1-3, Lk4:17-22, At3:18-24, Rm1:1-3a, 1Pt1:10-12a).

*Long-term Foretelling*: These prophecies provide the outline of the Plan of God:

<b><u>Long term roretening</u></b> . These prophetics provide the outline of the rith of God.	
The Protoevangelium: Genesis 3:15	All the Psalms that look to the World Tomorrow
The promises to Abraham: Genesis 12:1-7 etc.	Isaiah's prophecies: 4:1-6, 7:14, 9:6-7, 11:1-16, 24:1-23, 25:6-12, 26:1-12,19-21, 27:1-6 etc.

*Forthtelling*: is **proclaiming the teaching of God** concerning his requirements for True Worshippers. Almost always where "foretelling" occurs it is accompanied by "forthtelling" (Jr26:2-6). The Bible is the complete record of the teaching God has given us (Rv19:10b). <u>The Book of Revelation is structured around "forthtelling"</u> (Rv1:1-4a, 2:7,11,17,26, 3:5,12,21, 7:13-14, 8:3, 9:20-21, 10:7-11, 11:6-7a, 12:17, 13:8, 14:1-5,12, 15:2-4, 17:14, 19:7-9, 21:7, 22:3b,7b). **"Predictive prophecies" cannot be "kept"**. To "keep what is written" means to live by the Way of God.

<u>The Purpose of the Church</u>: God created the Church through the Apostles, who were prepared for the task by Jesus Christ (Mt24:14, 28:18-20). The Apostles did not at first understand their purpose (Jh20:9, 21:3a, At1:6). <u>The indwelling of the Holy Spirit was required before the Apostles understood</u> (Jh14:25-26, 16:12-13a). <u>The purpose of the Church is to "prophesy", to preach the gospel, to teach the Way of God as specified in the Bible</u>. Our understanding can only come through the lead of the Holy Spirit in studying <u>what the Bible actually says</u>, NOT what we would "like it to say", certainly NOT what someone says it says (Am3:7-8).

<u>What is the Church</u>? "We believe that the Church is that body of believers who have received and are being led by the Holy Spirit. <u>The true Church of God is a spiritual organism</u>." (Fundamental Beliefs of the United Church of God, page 49) The "Church" is a spiritual organism defined by the indwelling of the Holy Spirit (Rm8:9-10). <u>Only God knows who has</u> the indwelling of the Holy Spirit. <u>The "Church" is NOT confined to any physical organization</u>. <u>The primary purpose of</u> "prophecy" is "forthtelling" – that is the purpose of the "Church" to which we have been called. "Foretelling" has to be understood for what it is: "predictions", are there to support "forthtelling". Predictions are not an end in themselves (2Pt1:19-21, 2:2-3a). <u>"Predictions" will pass away, love will NOT</u> (1Cr13:8-9, 1Pt1:10).

We need to **NOT focus on the "predictive" aspects of prophecy** – different understandings are irrelevant. The Teaching of God with regard to salvation, is clear, unequivocal, and beyond doubt. **Our job as part of the "Church" is to preach the gospel** – we need to understand the Plan of God and live by the Way of God and **teach it to the world**. "When the **perfect comes**" our understanding of "prophetic" predictions will NOT matter: **God is Love – "love never ends"**.
