## **Ezekiel – Apostacy & Restoration**

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Chapter twenty of the Book of Ezekiel starts a new section of the Book, "<u>The Final Condemnation of Israel</u>". Chapter twenty starts out reviewing the history of Israel's apostacy and ends by looking to the restoration after the Second Advent. Ezekiel reviews Israel's apostacy in contrast to YHWH's continuous efforts to teach Israel his Way. <u>YHWH</u> <u>affirms that he will unequivocally accomplish his purpose in spite of Israel's apostacy</u>. (Ez20:31-32,8b-9a,41b-43)

**Those Who Refuse to Hear**: It is the summer of 591BC: Ezekiel has been active for about two years – his message is well known. A group of "elders" comes to Ezekiel probably representing **the majority of the exiles who were NOT responding to Ezekiel's call to repentance** (Ez20:1-5a). God provides Ezekiel with a scathing oracle of condemnation for the continued apostacy of Israel (Ez20:5b-8a).

### **Apostacy From Egypt to Moab**:

God's Mercy and Beneficence: YHWH reminds the people of his mercy in redeeming Israel from slavery in Egypt and his beneficence in teaching them the Way to life (Ez20:8b-12). YHWH briefly reviews the apostacy of the Exodus Generation (Ez20:13-17) and the Wilderness Generation (Ez20:18-22). YHWH warns that apostacy leads to application of the Covenant Curses (Ez20:23-24, Lv26:33,38, Dt28:64-68).

Statutes and mishepatim: Verse 25 has been historically one of the most controversial verses in all the Bible: "Moreover, I gave them statutes that were not good and [mishepatim] by which they could not have life". Beginning in the second century this verse has been used in polemic against the Jews and against "Judaizers" to argue that the teaching of God contained in the Writings of Moses is evil and NOT to be followed by "Christians". There is no word in English to which "mishepatim" can be translated. With respect to God's teaching, it means the wisdom, understanding, and discernment which can only be attained by living by the Way of God (Is26:7-9, Ps103:6-9, 36:5-6, 19:7-11).

The Eight Occurrences: The words "statutes" and "mishepatim" occur in juxtaposition eight times (Ez20:11,13,16,18, 19,21,24,25). In six of these verses, "statutes" is translated from "huqqah", in two verses, 18 and 25, it is translated from "hoq". In the six verses, the phrase "ប៉ុន្ទាប៉ុន្ន" - mishepatay, "mishepatam of me", is used: the statutes and mishepatim are from God. It is clear and specific in verse 18 that the "hoq" and the "mishepatim" are NOT from God — they are the way of the world. This is the key to verse 25. The Masoretic Text of verse 25 is ambiguous, but given the context, a "helper word" clarifies the translation: "Moreover I gave them [over to] statutes not good and mishepatim not live by them" (see the NIV translation).

**Back to the Exiles**: After reminding the "elders" about the ongoing apostacy of Israel in the Promised Land (Ez20:27-29), God again scathingly tells them that **their attitude is wrong and he will NOT respond to their queries** (Ez20:30-31). YHWH then tells them that **he will unequivocally accomplish his purpose**, but those who "**refuse to hear**" can go ahead and worship their idols and suffer the consequences (Ez20:33,39).

<u>The Restoration</u>: YHWH finally gives Ezekiel two oracles: <u>the Second Exodus</u> (Ez20:34-38); <u>the New Israel</u> (Ez20:40-44). After the Second Advent, God will call people from the four corners of the earth to migrate to the Promised Land and form a New Israel. The migration will be arduous, like the original Exodus. God calls it "<u>the wilderness of the peoples</u>", alluding to earlier prophecies (Hs2:14-15, 12:9, 13:4, Jr31:2). God is explicit that not everyone who starts out on the journey will make it (Ez20:38, 34:20-22, Mt22:14). <u>The key to participation in the New Israel is repentance – conversion</u> (Ez20:43).
