Electric fans and heaters are prohibited.

Exercise equipment is prohibited.

Appliances are prohibited.

All second level units have a balcony. Some balconies have a steel fence on 3-sides and some have a steel fence on 2-sides. Patios and balconies must be kept clean and free of debris. Do not use patios for storage except as specifically allowed below. Store loose items in

closed containers.

Allowed

Only outdoor patio furniture is allowed; indoor furniture, including folding metal chairs, is prohibited.

PB2 PB3 Electric grills and electric smokers are allowed to be stored and used. Bicycles are allowed to be stored (limited to 2). Bicycles are prohibited from being hung from the ceiling.

PB4 Plant containers with live plants, bulbs, or artificial plants are allowed. Plant containers with live plants or bulbs must have saucers or drip trays to prevent water accumulation.

PB5 Storage containers are allowed if they are enclosed and are not stacked and only in the following neutral colors: black, gray, beige, taupe, brown. Ice PB6 chests and ice coolers are not storage containers.

PB7 Mops, brooms, shovels, and similar items must be stored inside a container. PB8 Empty pots and planting soil must be stored inside a container. PB9 Toys must be stored inside a container.

Small wind chimes are allowed to be hung from wood only (not hardiboard or wood posts). If a neighbor complains about noise, wind chimes must be removed during complex quiet hours (11 pm through 7 am). Repair and paint wood after removal. Wreaths and decorations *may* be allowed to be hung (not attached) on doors at the sole discretion of the HOA.

PB₁₀ PB11 Up to 1/4 cord of firewood is allowed to be stored, not touching the patio/balcony or any part of the building, and must be neatly stacked and covered. PB12 Hanging plants with live plants, bulbs, or artificial plants are allowed to be hung from wood only (not hardiboard or wood posts). Repair and paint wood

after removal. Door entrance lights are allowed but must have clear, white, or yellow bulbs. Holiday decorative lights are allowed to be put up 15 days prior to the holiday and must be taken down within 15 days after the holiday. They must be

Shades may be allowed with prior written approval from the HOA. They must attach only to wood (not hardiboard or wood posts). Repair wood and PB16 paint after removal. It is in the sole discretion of the HOA whether to allow shades. Decorative art may be allowed with prior written approval from the HOA. Bright colors are discouraged. Attach only to wood (not hardiboard or wood **PB17** posts). Repair and paint wood after removal. It is in the sole discretion of the HOA whether to allow decorative art. Decorative lights <u>may</u> be allowed if they have clear bulbs and prior written approval from the HOA. Colored bulbs are not allowed. They must attach

PB18 only to wood (not hardiboard or wood posts). Repair and paint wood after removal. It is in the sole discretion of the HOA whether to allow decorative

A mesh barrier may be attached to the steel balcony fence for safety with prior written approval from the HOA. PB19

PB20 Electric insect zappers are prohibited.

Hazardous or flammable materials (including paint) are prohibited. PB21

Open flame cooking devices (propane/charcoal grills) are prohibited.

CE1	Plant containers with live plants, bulbs, or artificial plants are allowed in common areas adjacent to a unit, provided they do not interfere with
	landscaping work.
CE2	Plant containers must be cared for regularly (trimming, pruning, watering).
CE3	Bare dirt areas adjacent to a unit are allowed to be covered with dark brown wood mulch or Colorado/Austin river rock, with steel green or natural stone
	edging.
CE4	The area under stairwells and first level landings are designed to be covered with concrete, river rocks, or Asian Jasmine groundcover. Plant containers
	with live plants, bulbs or artificial plants are allowed to be placed on top of the concrete or river rocks, but not on top of the groundcover.
	Approval needed
CE5	Water hose hangers <u>may</u> be attached to brick and requires prior HOA approval. Water hoses must be neatly stored and not interfere with landscaping
	work, access to water spigot valves or access to building water cutoff valve boxes.
CE6	Yard art is discouraged in common elements adjacent to a unit and requires prior HOA approval. Bright colors are discouraged. Small concrete wildlife
	statues <u>may</u> be allowed. Yard art must not interfere with landscaping work. It is at the sole discretion of the HOA whether to allow yard art.

CE7	Consult neighbors and the HOA before placing plant containers in common elements.

CE9	The HOA maintains landscaping consistency. Certain plants are the sole responsibility of the HOA.
	Some owners had prior permission to plant small plants in the ground under stairwells or adjacent to their units. These may be "grandfathered" by the
CE10	HOA. No invasive species are allowed. It is at the sole discretion of the HOA whether to allow owners to put plants in the ground.
CE11	The HOA will strive to notify owners of issues with items in the common elements but reserves the right to remove items without notice or liability.

CE12	Plants in the ground by owners/residents is prohibited except "grandfathered" cases.

CE15	Placing non-allowed items in or adjacent to the trash dumpsters is prohibited.
CE16	Placing non-recyclable items in the recycle dumpster is prohibited.

Common elements are for all residents; do not hinder access.
