

Junior Representative



Role Summary:	Our junior representatives are the voice of BRC junior members; they also represent BRC and the wider society locally in their areas.
What's in it for you?	You will have the opportunity to make a difference for junior grassroots riders in your area. You will be meeting new people and building interpersonal skills. There would be an opportunity to present feedback at area level, therefore influencing the future direction of BRC.
Main duties and responsibilities:	<p>You will work with your area representative and the BRC staff team to support BRC activities. The specifics of your role will depend on the needs of your area, but it is likely to involve:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Representing the views of juniors from the area in which you have been elected at area committee meetings• Feeding back information from BRC to the juniors you represent in an impartial way• Representing BRC and the wider Society.• Attending junior forums and meetings• Engaging with the BRC team at HQ to review and improve BRC and the activities we support in your area.
Skills and Knowledge	<p>Essential</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Interest and enthusiasm for BRC and the wider Society• Excellent communication skills• You must be a member in the area you represent• Must be a current BRC member, either as an individual or as part of a club <p>Desirable</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Experience of volunteering
Training and Support:	The BRC team will provide you with guidance and support throughout your role. The BRC Team Leader will ensure you have access to appropriate induction, training and support from the BRC team.
Resources:	You will need a computer with email access and Microsoft Office. You must be willing to receive email, telephone and written correspondence from BRC and your area representative. This correspondence will also be copied to your parent/guardian.
Your commitment:	We ask all our junior representatives to commit to a minimum of a one year term, after this period you may continue if you are elected to do so by your area.
How do I get involved?	In the first instance you would approach your area representative to volunteer for the role; there is an application form to complete and send back to BRC. If there is more than one person willing to take on the role BRC will have the final say as to which candidates will be successful. Some areas have more than one junior representative but this is at the discretion of the area representative. If you have any questions about the role you can contact BRC.
