
I saw a great many cars that are not normally seen at the smaller shows as well as cars, well let me just say that any thing after 2000 is just a used car; is it not?





MARY VOICH'S FASHION PACE

The short coat with a wide collar set back from the face and the formal dress with the diagonal cut design were a popular combination in evening wear during 1930-31. There is a slight exaggeration of length on one side, and red camellias add color to the all-white dress of shining satin.

The popular use of ermine, was illustrated in this lovely version of the short evening wrap. The hori-



zontally worked fur is gathered into an incrustation in front, formed by the shawl collar, and then tied by means of scarf ends.

The evening slipper (top) is a Moire fabric with a gold kid lining to match the strap. Just below is a brocade slipper with a smart design in silver and blue. It has a silver leather band and heel.

Mike Vitetta's Tech Tips

Ammeter

The next time you are going to connect a trickle charger to boost your battery, connect negative clip to one terminal of the junction box on the firewall and the positive clip to a good ground, such as a cylinder head nut. A connection to one of the wing nuts will allow a reading on the cars ammeter while the other one will not show a reading.

Cleaning SmallParts

To clean small parts, use a metal bucket on a electric hot plate filled with Tide & water. Just run it on LOW temp. It will strip grease, crud, varnish like deposits, paint, etc. down to the metal!! Also softens & cleans carbon from pistons, rods, valves, even crankshafts & camshafts, heads, and pans.

Cheap ultrasonic foot washer with Tide & aquarium gravel does nuts, bolts, and small stuff really well!

Lighting Circuit By Lynn Sondenaa

The fourth electrical circuit in the Model A is the lighting circuit. It consists of the headlights, tail light, brake light, brake light switch, dash light, and interior lights on special closed cars. Also, the light switch, bulb and necessary wires. I have also grouped the horn and windshield wiper into this circuit. It could be argued that they do not belong here.

The number one problem in this circuit is grounding. A poor ground will cause dim or no lights at all. The second cause can be shorts in the wiring circuit. Shorts are where hot wires touch metal (ground). If a wire is crushed or rubs against something long enough it will cause a bare spot in the insulation. This bare spot will cause the short. Corrosion can also be a factor. Use a small brass wire brush to clean terminals, the end of bulbs, and light sockets. It is also a good idea to coat these connections with dielectric grease, as it prevents corrosion and promotes better contact between the two surfaces.

To test this circuit it is best to have a 10 foot piece of 16 gage wire with alligator clips on each ends, this will be used as a temporary ground. Hook one end directly to the battery + positive post and the other end can be used to test for grounds.

You will also need a test light with a probe and a multi meter is also helpful. No wiring diagram is supplied with this article. They are present in most Model A books.

What does AR stand for?

"A" stands for the first design of a part, and "R" means the part is kept in stock for REPAIRS to fix cars that used the earlier design of that part, because the later design won't work. Early 1928 wheels is one example.

There is a move on to stop using the word AR and start using early '28. AR is correct for parts, but not the car as a whole.

Many of the "AR" parts are for the earlier cars but even the 400-A Convertible Sedan which was only built in the last half of 1931 had "AR" parts. "AR" really does not mean much if anything. To make it meaningful one would have to say "Early 1928 AR" parts. But I think just "Early 1928" is enough to get the meaning.
