Frank and I took advantage of the invitation from the Miami club to visit the Creative Workshop in Dania Beach.

What a place! First of all when we arrived we were met by the owner Jason Wenig and his family. They had coffee, juice, water, champagne, and assorted pastries and muffins.

After introductions the tour and car talk began. Jason's place is 10,000 square feet and every part of it had some vehicle in the process of being restored. At the time of our visit he hade everything from a 5/8 scale Cord with a fiberglass body and ford running gear to a hand crafted aluminum bodied custom sports car that they made and was damaged at the Scottsdale auction when the tents blew down.

The shop has seen everything from model T's to one of a kind factory prototypes like the all aluminum and wood AC sports car made by the same people that made the AC Cobra.

Jason has a wide variety in tastes. He is as passionate about a car that he is working on for Pebble Beach as he is for the shops rat rod that started out as just one door that was laying around. The Pebble beach car at first glance looked like it was already done but Jason informed us that is arrived that way and was all messed up. He proceeded to show us all the problems with the fit and finish. This just goes to show how meticulous he and his employees are when it comes to restorations.

The shop has most tools to most work in house such as mills, lathes, drill presses and such. There is a paint booth and body work area and even a plating station where they plate their own small parts.

Frank and I had a good time and learned quite a bit in the short time we were there. I'm only sorry that more of the club could not attend and see the kind of work that goes on in our own backyard.




Tiny Tips From MAFCA Members

Furnace Filter & Spray Can Cap

Small bolts, nuts and screws are easy to paint using a spray can paint, if they are supported by a

piece of furnace filter as shown. Nuts can be supported by tapering a short dowel slightly on one end to support the nut, and tapering the other end enough to allow inserting it in the furnace filter. The dowels and filter can be used over and over without a buildup of



paint on the surface. If a screw, bolt or nut is marred while attaching to a vehicle, it can be touched up very easily. Take the same paint can and remove the cap and spray just a small amount of paint into the cap, using it like a cup. Then using a small brush, dip into the cap and touch up the marred item. Paint in the cap can be wiped out or allowed to dry before replacing it on the can. The only clean up is cleaning the brush.

We've all heard the famous words, "They can have any color they want, as long as it's black," attributed to Henry Ford in reference to the first Ford automobiles. When did other colors become available?

—Janice Grimes, Rio Rancho, N.M. Many people think Ford's Model T was available only in black. In fact, it also was offered in blue, green and bright red from 1908 to 1914, when the moving assembly line was introduced. The new production process required a fast-drying paint, and only a particular black one suited the purpose. Thus began the "black, black or black" period, which lasted until 1925.
