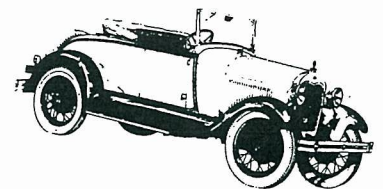
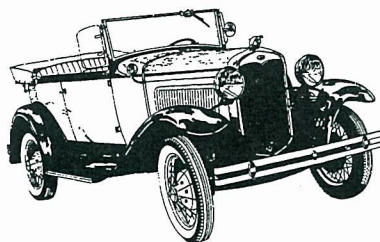
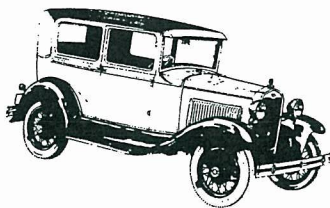
I discovered that I need to put together another short letter. Folks have been calling, emailing, and asking how I am doing and I should send out an update. I thank you for your prayers and support. It definitely does make a difference to this guy.

My attitude is still the same positive spiritually as before. I have been waking up every morning to another great day in paradise and each continues to be another great gift from God. I try to make the best of every one. God gave me a wonderful partner to spend it with, so spending my time being positive and practicing my spirituality as well as the support from the Knights and Ushers and the Church parishioners and staff has been a great gift in dealing with this unexpected challenge in life. This second chance at life has been a most wonderful blessing and experience. I was able to find out that while I was in brain surgery a member from the car club as well as members of the Knights of Columbus were there praying and supporting the members of my family.

As for the chemo and radiation, last week was the mid-point so when we finish those we return to Duke University for another evaluation to see if the medications and radiation are working. They even supplied us with the tickets on South West for this trip up and back. So, how am I doing? I have no complaints. I have a few radiation burns where the tumor was located and removed because they keep hitting that one spot, but I still have most all of my hair for now. Some of the other meds make me lethargic and lazy tired so I borrowed an exercise bike and put lots of time on that, and Mary and I walk in the evenings. Sometimes I find myself riding that stationary bike while I am sleeping.

I was about 225 lbs and did drop to 211 for a while but my brother came to town for a week and between him and a few other friends taking me out for breakfast and lunch, this morning I was 217. Some of the other bad stuff that they said I could experience has not happened yet. In Theory, I will be able to drive again in July as long as everything continues to go as planned.

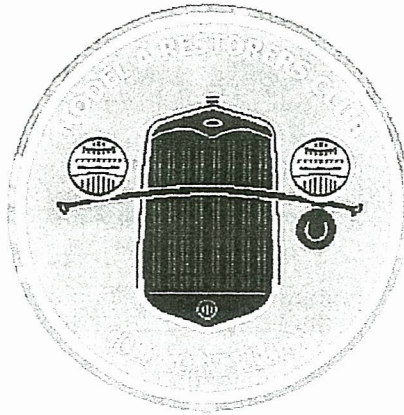

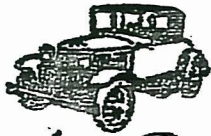

'A' Seaside Rendezvous

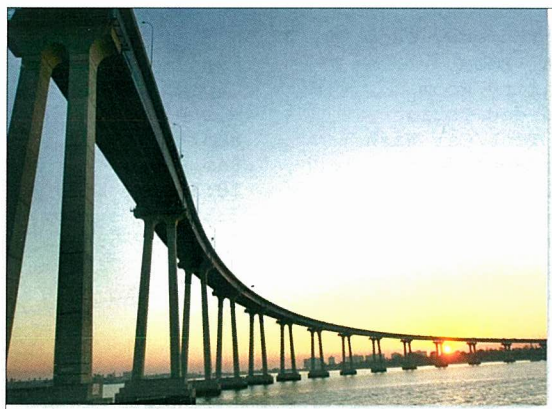

How about a fantastic drive over the majestic Coronado Bay Bridge? The drive gives a great view of the San Diego harbor and the Naval Station San Diego.

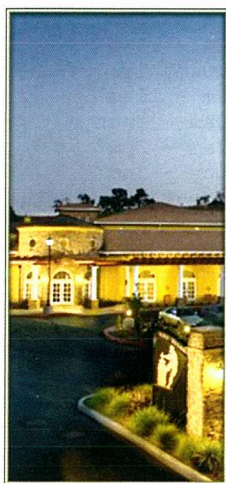


The activities calendar is filling up as we plan events for the meet. Fine Point judging, Touring Class judging, Fashion judging are all being fine tuned.

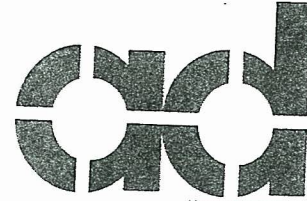
