TECHNICAL TIP

This issue's technical tip is rather simple. How many of us have tried to remove the square fill and drain plug from the rear end housing, only to find the plug's square receptacle all distorted? I have seen evidence of pipe wrenches, vise-grips, and chisels used to remove these plugs. All of these damaged or distorted the plug to varying degrees. We should all be aware of the fact that the adjustable wrench originally furnished in the Model A tool kit has a square bottom end on it designed especially for the purpose of loosening or tightening this plug. Most of the time this plug is over tightened and the Model A adjustable wrench is not heavy enough to break it loose.

Here's where my technical tip comes in. Instead of using the Model A adjustable wrench to remove or tighten the rear end plug, here's what I like to use and it works well for me. I use a 3/8" drive ratchet with a short extension on it. Making sure there is no old grease or dirt in the center of the plug, insert the extension into it. With a little pressure on the extension to make sure it stays in place, gently move the ratchet handle in the direction to remove or install the plug.

Once it breaks loose, the plug will spin right out. When tightening, remember, the plug is slightly tapered so when it get snug, maybe tighten it only 1/8 more of a turn.

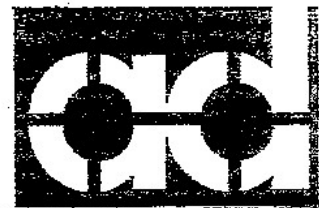

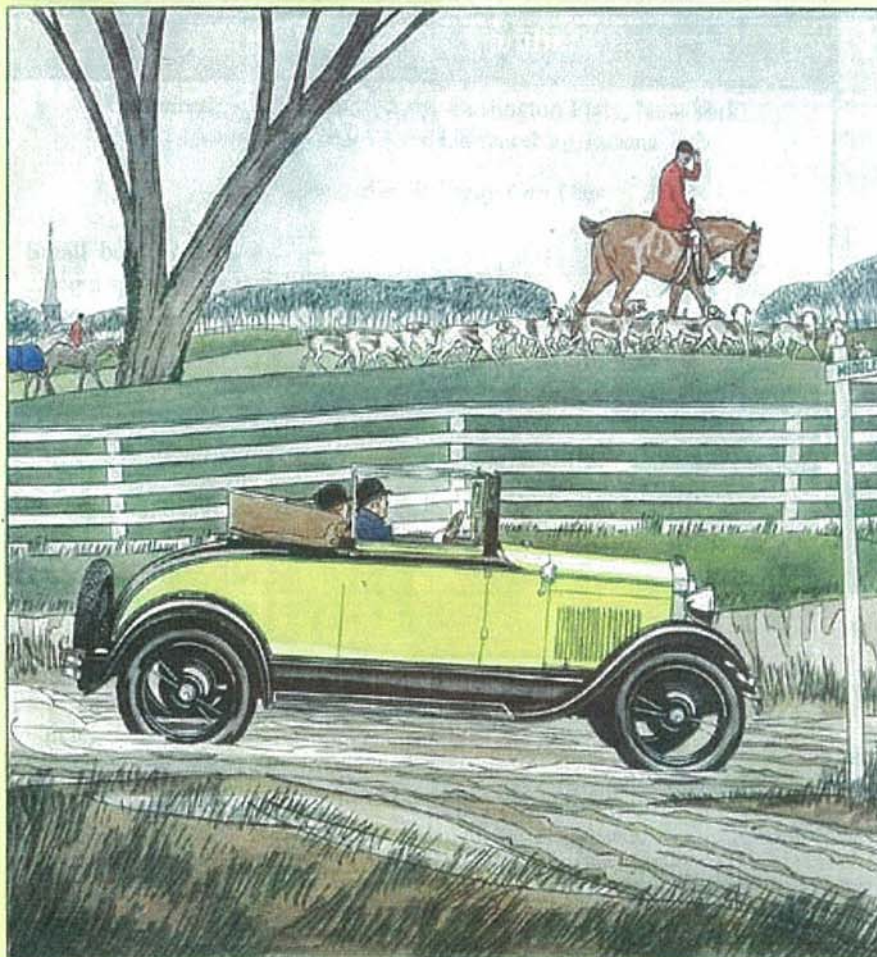

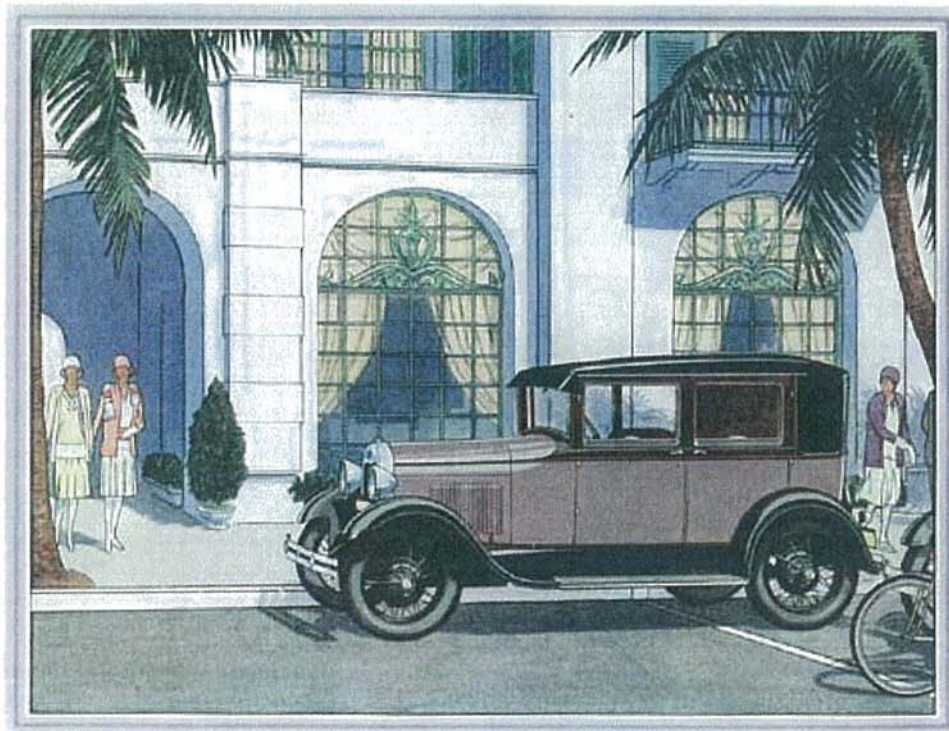
