A native of Odessa, Mr. Kushneruk served as the Deputy Chief of Protocol to the President of Ukraine for six years before being appointed Consul General of Ukraine in San Francisco in 2020. His consular district includes Alaska, Arizona, California, Hawaii, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, Oregon, Utah, Washington, and Wyoming. He is married with two children. Recently, Ms. Anon inspired Stanford Ignite Ukraine, an accelerator business program at the Stanford Graduate School of Business for 42 Ukrainian entrepreneurs, which began in February 2024.
