Matt worked in the gourmet food industry before spending nearly 20 years at Marin Municipal Water District, retiring in 2017 as a Customer Service Field Inspector. While serving on MMWD's Safety Advisory Committee, he developed the Employee Emergency Backpack Program, which became a model for Mill Valley and other Marin County cities and towns.
