USA Tax Revenue Stamps.

The Tax Duty stamp on American cigarette packets was introduced in 1932 and is useful guide to the date that the pack was in circulation. There is a small number at the bottom right-hand corner of the top panel above the portrait on the stamp. In 1932 this number was 102. The number then progressed annually up until 1954 when the stamp was abolished. So, by referring to the chart below, you can accurately date American cigarette packets produced between 1932 and 1954.
