

Missions and Role

- ▶ Daily Mutual Aid (Over 1,100 Local Activations Annually)
- ▶ Single Point Statewide Resource – One Stop Shop
Fire/EMS/Special Ops (HM – TRT – Water – US&R – MIST)
- ▶ Statewide All-Risk Response Plan with CAD
- ▶ Interstate CAD By Resource
- ▶ Specialized Resource Access & Assignment
- ▶ Sustained Operations – Weeks/Months
- ▶ Economy of Scale Opportunities – Purchasing-Sharing-Cooperation
- ▶ Grant Management – Feds & State

- ▶ NRF – National Response Framework – FEMA - Federal
- ▶ MAMA-C – Daily Mutual Aid Interstate
- ▶ Member Agencies – MABAS Contract, Ordinance, Secretary’s Certificate, Addendum
