



SELECTION & NOMINATION POLICY FOR 2026 ASIAN GAMES

19 SEPTEMBER – 04 OCTOBER 2026

DRESSAGE || JUMPING || EVENTING

1. INTRODUCTION

1.1 The 2026 Asian Games will be held in Aichi-Nagoya Japan, from 19 September to 04 October 2026.

2. OBJECTIVE

2.1 This Selection & Nomination Policy (Policy) describes the process and criteria set under the Equestrian Federation of Singapore (EFS) to select and nominate athletes to the Singapore National Olympic Council (SNOC) for the representation of Singapore at the 2026 Asian Games.

2.2 This Policy is guided by the principle that only those who have the highest potential or a high potential to make Singapore proud at the Games would be selected and nominated by EFS, while FINAL selection of athletes remains at the discretion of SNOC.

2.3 This Policy is to select the athlete/horse combinations for the Team who can deliver the best possible results for Singapore at the 2026 Asian Games. Details of the Team composition shall be with reference to, and in accordance with, the Technical Handbook of the 2026 Asian Games as such may be published and, from time to time, amended by the event organisers.

2.4 EFS will publish the Policy via email broadcast, including any updates or changes to the Policy. Athletes and coaches will be responsible for ensuring that they are fully aware of and understand the Policy and its content, as well as updates and changes, if any, to the Policy.

3. CONFIDENTIALITY

3.1 It is vitally important for the integrity of the Policy and those involved in its application as athletes, selectors or other officials, to uphold a high degree of confidentiality relating to information which may have a bearing on the selection at all times.

3.2 Any person who breaks this confidentiality may be removed from the selection and nomination process. All confidential information, conversations and discussions will be identified as such.

4. ELIGIBILITY FOR ATHLETES & HORSES

4.1 To be eligible for Selection by SNOC for the 2026 Asian Games, the athlete must:

- be a Singapore citizen, and should not be holding dual citizenship if they are 22 years old and above, at the time of nomination;
- be, unless otherwise stated in the Technical Handbook, at least (16) years of age (born in 2010 or before) for Dressage; (18) years of age (born in 2008 or before) for Jumping; (18) years of age (born in 2008 or before) for Eventing;
- be a registered and recognised athlete by the Equestrian Federation of Singapore;
- be eligible to compete for Singapore in International Events according to the FEI General Regulations and the Technical Handbook;



- be able and willing to undertake an agreed training and competition programme recommended by the High Performance Manager after consultation with the athlete;
- submit a detailed training and competition plan to the EFS Selections Committee upon application for Team selection;
- obtain the qualifying scores set out below, as applicable for their discipline;
- have signed the Athlete Agreement;
- submit qualifying scores as athlete/horse combinations;
- have acted and at all times act in such a manner so as to not bring the athlete, the sport or EFS into public disrepute or censure;
- not have used nor administered any substance to the Horse that is in contravention of the FEI Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Regulations unless they have been sanctioned for the breach and completed the sanction imposed.

4.2 To be eligible for Selection by SNOG for 2026 Asian Games, the horse must:

- be at least (8) years old (born in 2018 or before) for Big Tour Dressage
- be at least (7) years old (born in 2019 or before) for Small Tour Dressage;
- be at least (8) years old (born in 2018 or before) for Jumping;
- be at least (6) years old (born in 2020 or before) for Eventing;
- be registered with FEI and the athlete is responsible to ensure the fulfilment of the registration;
- have a valid FEI Passport or an FEI approved national passport with a valid FEI Recognition Card as a means of identification and to establish ownership;
- not be subject to a current sanction under the FEI Equine Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Regulations.

5. NOMINATION CRITERIA

- Only athlete/horse combinations who have met all eligibility conditions in Clause (4) will be considered for selection and nomination.
- All achievements must be attained between 1 May 2025 and 15 June 2026, or before the Organising Committee's Entry-By-Name deadline (to be confirmed), whichever is earlier.
- Pursuant to the Olympic Charter (By laws to Rules 27 and 28, paragraph 2.1), "Selection shall be based not only on the sports performance of an athlete, but also on his ability to serve as an example to the sporting youth of his country."

5.1 Other Performance Factors¹

- Athlete/horse combination's consistency and most recent form
- Athlete/horse combination's health and fitness to compete
- Ability of athlete to cope with pressure
- Attitude and behaviour towards coaches, teammates, fellow athletes, officials and sports administrators, whether in relation to sporting matters or otherwise.
- General conduct and character which may affect the reputation, image, values or best interests of the athlete or the sport.
- Ability of athlete to be a good ambassador for Singapore and Equestrian sports.
- Ability of athlete to contribute to a positive team atmosphere.
- Past disciplinary record.
- Current skill level and fitness; and character



- Level of commitment and attendance, including adherence to any set training programme submitted to EFS
- Potential for future development, taking into consideration current sporting results, feedback from coaches etc.
- Ability to demonstrate team spirit and work well with teammates and officials; and
- Such other non-performance related qualities as the selectors may consider to be relevant.
- Athlete's previous experience, performance at FEI International competitions
- Achievement of the Policy's objectives

1 In line with global and/or regional health regulations, athletes should be aware of the possibility of vaccination requirements imposed as prerequisites for participation in the 2026 Asian Games and, in submitting themselves for consideration, agree to comply with such prerequisites (if any) should they be selected to the Team

5.2 Competition and Training Observation

- The selectors may invite athlete/ horse combinations to compete at a specific show to compare the combinations performing under the same conditions
- The selectors may wish to see athlete/ horse combinations in training with their own coach and/ or their Team coach from time to time, particularly if the combination has not competed in the previous 3 months
- The selectors may request the athlete/ horse to undergo medical assessment by the Team Doctor/ Vet to ascertain fitness for selection
- Any of the above listed requests should be accommodated without delay by the athlete to assist the EFS Selections Committee to make the best selection decisions possible
- Athletes are not obliged to accept such requests but to not do so may have an impact on their selection prospects

6. APPLICATION TO BE CONSIDERED FOR SELECTION

All athletes whether local or overseas based who wish to be considered for selection for the 2026 Asian Games must submit the following documents to EFS as early as possible and no later than 15 June 2026 (*exact date pending the nomination deadline via SportSync*) unless otherwise stated or later accepted by the Selections Committee:

- Completed Expression of Interest Form (*For Selection Committee Confirmation*)
- Digital Photo (JPEG Format)
- Passport Copy (JPEG Format)
- Results of athlete/ horse combinations (ongoing requirement)
- Detailed training & competition plan up to the Games
- Videos submitted by YouTube or other links and (where applicable ie Dressage, Jumping) all judges' test sheets and results sheets of qualifying performances (ongoing requirement) and obtain the qualifying scores in paragraphs 7, 8 below as applicable. The term "qualifying scores" in these Criteria or the Policy refers to scores required for qualification for the long list, nomination to the short list or Team selection, as context requires

7. QUALIFICATION & NOMINATION (DRESSAGE)

7.1 Qualification for the Long List (Dressage)

Athletes seeking to qualify for the long list must obtain the following scores:

- Obtain 3 scores of minimum 65% in the FEI Prix St. Georges class at FEI and EFS sanctioned events.



- Scores obtained at FEI Intermediate I will be valued at 1% than those in FEI Prix St. Georges. eg 66% at FEI Intermediate I will be valued at 67% for comparison against 66% at FEI Prix St. Georges in the selection process.
- Scores obtained in classes at FEI Medium Tour Level (excluding Freestyle to Music) will be valued at 2% higher than those achieved at FEI Prix St. Georges. eg 66% at Intermediate II will be valued at 68% for comparison against a 66% score at FEI Prix St. Georges in the selection process.
- Scores obtained in classes at FEI Big Tour Level (excluding Freestyle to Music) will be valued at 3% higher than those achieved at FEI Prix St. Georges. eg 66% at Grand Prix will be valued at 69% for comparison against a 66% score at FEI Prix St. Georges in the selection process.
- Long list qualifying scores must be obtained on an athlete's own horse or on leased, contracted, sponsored horse with written proof of the athlete's and owner's commitment to provide the horse for Team Singapore for the event under selection
- Qualifying scores obtained overseas must be at a national or FEI-sanctioned event of suitable standard
- It is required that there is at least one FEI Accredited Judge, or a national equivalent judge qualified to judge at the relevant levels or above on the panel of each FEI and/or EFS sanctioned event and that this judge also scores the combination. In the case of a judge with equivalent national qualifications, the responsibility lies with the athlete to provide evidence of such qualifications and the EFS Selections Committee may, in its discretion, reject any qualifying score for consideration if in the view of the Committee the veracity of such qualifications is in doubt.
- Athletes must check with EFS Selections Committee prior to competing overseas in any particular class whether that class will be accepted
- Athletes must inform EFS of every competition they participate in at the relevant levels and must submit ALL RESULTS that count towards the Long List and Short List. These submissions must include the official scores, as well as the names of the judges, video recording and all judges' test sheets must be submitted for every result being logged with EFS to count towards qualification, nomination or selection.

7.2 Nomination to the Short List (Dressage)

Athletes seeking nomination to the short list must obtain the following scores:

- Athletes must meet the **Minimum Eligibility Requirements (MER)** as stipulated by the Organising Committee or by such other deadline as may be amended and published in any revised edition of the Technical Handbook, to be eligible for consideration for nomination and/or selection.
- Obtain at least 3 scores of minimum 70% in FEI Intermediate I equivalent to the 6th-placed rider in the 2022 Hangzhou Asian Games in the individual qualifying test to the Final.
- Scores obtained in classes at Medium Tour Level (excluding Freestyle to Music) will be valued at 1% higher than those achieved at FEI Intermediate I. eg 69% at Intermediate II or equivalent will be valued at 70% for comparison against a 69% score at FEI Intermediate I in the selection process
- Scores obtained in classes at Big Tour Level (excluding Freestyle to Music) will be valued at 2% higher than those achieved at FEI Intermediate I. eg 69% at Grand Prix or equivalent will be valued at 71% for comparison against a 69% score at FEI Intermediate I in the selection process
- Scores for nomination to the short list and Team selection must be on the athlete's own horse or on a contracted, leased or sponsored horse with written proof of the athlete's and owner's commitment to provide the horse for Team Singapore for the event under selection
- A final Selection Trial may be held closer to the nomination and/ or entry-by-name deadline set by the SNOC
- Qualifying scores obtained overseas must be at a national or FEI-sanctioned event of suitable standard



- It is required that there is at least one FEI Accredited Judge, or a national equivalent judge qualified to judge at relevant levels or above on the panel of each FEI and/or EFS sanctioned event and that this judge also scores the combination. In the case of a judge with equivalent national qualifications, the responsibility lies with the athlete to provide evidence of such qualifications and the EFS Selections Committee may, in its discretion, reject any qualifying score for consideration if in the view of the Committee the veracity of such qualifications is in doubt.
- Athletes must check with EFS Selections Committee prior to competing overseas in any particular class whether that class will be accepted
- Athletes must inform EFS of every competition they participate in at the relevant levels and must submit ALL results that count towards the Long List and Short List. These submissions must include the official scores, as well as the names of the judges, video recordings and all judges' test sheets must be submitted for every result being logged with EFS to count towards qualification, nomination or selection and scores for nomination to the short list must be submitted by 15 June 2026 although the EFS Selections Committee reserves the right to accept any scores submitted after this date.
- Notwithstanding the above, the EFS Selections Committee may consider and nominate to SNOG athletes who miss the qualifying standard marginally, whether in terms of scores or the number of data points set out above, but show potential to equal or surpass 6th placing in the event in time for the Games ("On-track Athlete").

7.3 Specific competitions as Selection Trials (Dressage)

7.3.1 EFS may organise or specify any FEI or EFS-sanctioned competition as a Selection Trial in Singapore or overseas to obtain qualifying scores.

7.3.2 The EFS Selections Committee reserves the right to revise the criteria set out in this paragraph 7 to align the same with the Technical Handbook, upon its publication. Any such revision of the paragraph will be disseminated in the manner set out in paragraph 2.4 above.

8. QUALIFICATION & NOMINATION (JUMPING)

8.1 Qualification for the Long List (Jumping)

Athletes seeking to qualify for the long list must obtain the following scores:

- Obtain 3 scores at FEI and/or EFS sanctioned events either (i) with a maximum of 4 faults, in 1.45m jumping classes or (ii) with a with maximum of 8 faults in 1.50cm jumping classes or higher.
- A qualifying score must be obtained on a competition course designed by a FEI Course Designer or equivalent Course Designer qualified to build courses at the height of competition for which the score is submitted or higher. In the case of a Course Designer with equivalent national qualifications, the responsibility lies with the athlete to provide evidence of such qualifications and the EFS Selections Committee may, in its discretion, reject any qualifying score for consideration if in the view of the Committee the veracity of such qualifications is in doubt.
- For scores to count, they can be obtained in the following:
- Competitions against the clock under FEI Jumping Rules (28th Edition I Updates effective 01 January 2026.) Article 220.2, where there is a minimum of 2 double combinations
- Normal Competition over one round under FEI Jumping Rules (28th Edition I Updates effective 01 January 2026.) Article 220.
- Competition Over Two Rounds under FEI Jumping Rules (28th Ed.) Article 221. In the second instance, if the 2 rounds are unequal in length, only the longer round can be submitted for a qualifying score. If the 2 rounds are identical in every way, each round can be submitted as a separate qualifying score.



- Two-Phase competition under FEI Jumping Rules (28th Ed.) Article 222, where there is a minimum of 2 double combinations, both phases completed in a normal class, or Special Two-Phase.
- The following competition formats will not count: Puissance or 6 Bar; Accumulator; Table C; Power & Speed; Jump Off.
- Long list qualifying scores must be obtained on an athlete's own horse or on leased, contracted or sponsored horse with written proof of the athlete's and owner's commitment to provide the horse for Team Singapore for the event under selection
- Qualifying scores obtained overseas must be at FEI sanctioned events or national equivalent e.g. BSJA, EA
- EFS must be informed of the name of the FEI Course Designer and FEI designation or national equivalent prior to the event
- Athletes must check with the EFS Selections Committee prior to competing overseas in any particular class whether that class will be accepted
- Athletes must inform EFS of every competition in which they participate at the relevant levels and must submit ALL RESULTS for competitions at the heights stipulated for Long List and Short List qualification. These submission must include the official results, the names of the FEI Judges and the FEI Course Designer, as well as the relevant supporting documents, video recordings and course plans, must be provided for every competition for the result to be recognised by EFS for the purposes of qualification, nomination, or selection.

8.2 Nomination to the Short List (Jumping)

Athletes seeking nomination to the short list must obtain the following scores:

- Athletes must meet the **Minimum Eligibility Requirements (MER)** as stipulated by the Organising Committee or by such other deadline as may be amended and published in any revised edition of the Technical Handbook, to be eligible for consideration for nomination and/or selection.
- For entry into the Individual Competition (heights of up to 1.5m), obtain 3 scores, each with maximum 2 Faults, in 1.50m jumping classes or higher at FEI or EFS sanctioned events, equivalent to the 6th-placed rider in the 2022 Hangzhou Asian Games in the individual showjumping final.
- For entry into the Individual Competition (heights of up to 1.55m), obtain 3 scores, each with maximum 4 faults, in 1.55m jumping classes or higher at FEI or EFS sanctioned events.
- A qualifying score must be obtained on a competition course designed by a FEI Course Designer or a national equivalent Course Designer qualified to build courses according to the relevant level. In the case of a Course Designer with equivalent national qualifications, the responsibility lies with the athlete to provide evidence of such qualifications and the EFS Selections Committee may, in its discretion, reject any qualifying score for consideration if in the view of the Committee the veracity of such qualifications is in doubt.
- For scores to count, they can be obtained in the following:
- Competitions under FEI Jumping Rules (28th Edition I Updates effective 01 January 2026.) against the clock Article 220.2, where there is a minimum of 2 double combinations
- Normal Competition over one round under FEI Jumping Rules (28th Edition I Updates effective 01 January 2026.) Article 220.
- Competition Over Two Rounds under FEI Jumping Rules (28th Ed.) Article 221. In the second instance, if the 2 rounds are unequal in length, only the longer round can be submitted for a qualifying score. If the 2 rounds are identical in every way, each round can be submitted as a separate qualifying score.
- Two-Phase competition under FEI Jumping Rules (28th Ed.) Article 222, where there is a minimum of 2 double combinations, both phases completed in a normal class, or Special Two-Phase.



- The following competition formats will not count: Puissance or 6 Bar; Accumulator; Table C; Power & Speed; Jump Off.
- Scores for short list and Team selection must be on the athlete's own horse or on a contracted, leased or sponsored horse with written proof of the athlete's and owner's commitment to provide the horse for Team Singapore for the event under selection
- A final Selection Trial may be held closer to the nomination and/ or entry-by-name deadline set by the SNOC
- Qualifying scores obtained overseas must be at FEI sanctioned events or national equivalent e.g. BSJA, EA
- EFS must be informed of the name of the FEI Course Designer and FEI designation or national equivalent prior to the event
- Athletes must check with the EFS Selections Committee prior to competing overseas in any particular class whether that class will be accepted
- Athletes must inform EFS of every competition they participate in at the relevant levels and must submit ALL RESULTS for those competitions at the height stipulated for Short List. These submissions must include the official scores, the names of the FEI Judges and the FEI Course Designer, as well as the relevant supporting document, video recordings and course plans, must be provided for every competition result being logged with EFS to count towards qualification, nomination or selection and scores for nomination to the short list must be submitted by 15 June 2026 although the EFS Selections Committee reserves the right to accept any scores submitted after this date
- Notwithstanding the above, the EFS Selections Committee may consider and nominate to SNOC athletes who miss the qualifying standard marginally, whether in terms of scores or the number of data points set out above, but show potential to equal or surpass 6th placing in the event in time for the Games ("On-track Athlete").

8.3 Specific competitions as Selection Trials (Jumping)

8.3.1 EFS may organise or specify any FEI or EFS-sanctioned competition as a Selection Trial in Singapore or overseas to obtain qualifying scores

8.3.2 The EFS Selections Committee reserves the right to revise the criteria set out in this paragraph 8 to align the same with the Technical Handbook, upon its publication. Any such revision of the paragraph will be disseminated in the manner set out in paragraph 2.4 above

9. QUALIFICATION & NOMINATION (EVENTING)

9.1 Qualification for the Long List (Eventing)

Athletes seeking to qualify for the long list must obtain the following scores:

- To qualify for long list Athletes must meet the **Minimum Eligibility Requirements (MER)** as stipulated by the Organising Committee or by such other deadline as may be amended and published in any revised edition of the Technical Handbook, to be eligible for consideration for nomination and/or selection.
- Long list qualifying scores must be obtained on an athlete's own horse or on leased, contracted or sponsored horse with written proof of the athlete's and owner's commitment to provide the horse for Team Singapore for the event under selection
- Qualifying scores obtained overseas must be at FEI sanctioned events.
- Athletes must check with the EFS Selections Committee prior to competing overseas in any particular class whether that class will be accepted



- Athletes must inform EFS of every competition they participate in at the relevant levels and must submit ALL RESULTS that count towards the Long List and Short List. These submissions must include the official scores, as well as the names of the FEI Technical Delegate, FEI Judges and FEI Cross Country and Jumping Course Designers and relevant supporting documents, video recordings, course plan must be submitted for every result being logged with EFS to count towards qualification, nomination or selection

9.2 Nomination to the Short List (Eventing)

Athletes seeking nomination to the short list must obtain the following scores:

- Successful completion of two (2) Eventing competitions with a minimum of the following technical level at FEI sanctioned events²
 - 1) 3* Dressage Eventing Test – no more than 32 penalties
 - 2) 3* Show Jumping Eventing Course – with 0 penalties
 - 3) CCI 2* L Cross Country Course – with 0 penalties
- Higher selection ranking will be given to those riders who are more experienced with a proven competitive riding record. Ranking will be prioritised for successful completion of CCI2*, CCI3*, CCI4*
- Scores for short list and Team selection must be on the athlete's own horse or on a contracted, leased or sponsored horse, with written proof of the athlete's and owner's commitment to provide the horse for Team Singapore for the event under selection
- A final Selection Trial may be held closer to the nomination and/ or entry-by-name deadline set by the SNOC
- Qualifying scores obtained overseas must be at FEI sanctioned events.
- Athletes must check with the EFS Selections Committee prior to competing overseas in any particular class whether that class will be accepted
- Athletes must inform EFS of every competition they participate in at the relevant levels and must submit ALL RESULTS that count towards the Long List and Short List. These submissions must include the official scores, as well as the names of the FEI Technical Delegate, FEI Judges and FEI Cross Country and Jumping Course Designers as well as the relevant document, videos recordings and course plan must be submitted for every result being logged with EFS to count towards qualification, nomination or selection and results for the nomination to the short list must be submitted by 15 June 2026, although the EFS Selections Committee reserves the right to accept any results submitted after this date.
- Notwithstanding the above, the EFS Selections Committee may consider and nominate to SNOC athletes who miss the qualifying standard marginally, whether in terms of scores or the number of data points set out above, but show potential to equal or surpass 6th placing in the event in time for the Games ("On-track Athlete").

9.3 Specific competition as Selection Trials (Eventing)

- 9.3.1 EFS may organise or specify any FEI or EFS-sanctioned competition as a Selection Trial in Singapore or overseas obtain to qualifying scores
- 9.3.2 The EFS Selections Committee reserves the right to revise the criteria set out in this paragraph 9 in order to align the same with the Technical Handbook, upon its publication. Any such revision of the paragraph will be disseminated in the manner set out in paragraph 2.4 above

10. NOMINATION PROCESS

10.1 EFS will submit selected athletes for nominations to SNOC, based on the eligibility and nomination criteria outlined in this Policy. If, based on such criteria, the number of athletes equally eligible for nomination exceeds



the entry limit of the discipline, more weight will be given to the most recent results submitted by the athlete and overall consistency of the specific rider/horse combination.

10.2 All nominations approved by the EFS Selections Committee will be submitted to SNOC. The successful nominations will be announced via email broadcast.

10.3 As the national body representing to Olympic Council of Asia (OCA), SNOC has the sole and final decision in the selection of athletes to represent Singapore at the 2026 Asian Games.

10.4 Prior to selection by SNOC, EFS reserves the right to replace any athlete nominated for the Games with another athlete meeting the short list requirements (or falling within the definition of an On-track Athlete referred to in paragraph 7.2, 8.2 and 9.2 respectively) and on the original longlist if the original athlete is unable or EFS deems him/her unsuitable for participation in the Games. Subsequent to selection by SNOC, if for similar reason an athlete needs to be replaced, EFS reserves the right to nominate another athlete meeting the short list requirements (or falling within the definition of an On-track Athlete referred to in paragraph 7.2, 8.2 and 9.2 respectively) and on the original longlist to SNOC for selection in place of the original athlete. If such replacement occurs after the Entry-By-Name deadline, the replacement is further subject to approval by the Games Organising Committee in accordance with their late athlete replacement policy.

11. APPEAL PROCESS

11.1. Appeal against non-nomination by EFS must be made in writing to the Chairperson of the EFS Appeals Committee within 48-hours of the announcement of the athletes being nominated by EFS for selection for the 2026 Asian Games.

11.2. An appeal to the EFS Appeals Committee must be made in writing with supporting documentation and must be accompanied by a deposit of S\$200.00. If the appeal is successful, the deposit will be refunded in full.

11.3 The Appeals Committee will convene and deliberate on the appeal within five (5) working days of receipt and will provide its decision as soon as reasonably practicable after consideration of all relevant factors.

11.4 Appeals shall state the specific ground(s) on which the appeal is made and include all evidence deemed relevant by the appellant in relation to such ground(s).

11.5. The EFS Appeals Committee will, in writing, inform all parties about the decision taken to either uphold or reject the appeal. The decision will be final, and no further correspondence will be entertained.

12. DE-SELECTION OF ATHLETES & HORSES

12.1 An athlete selected for the 2026 Asian Games may be de-selected by SNOC/EFS from the team if he/she:

- Due to illness or injury becomes unable to perform to the required standard in the opinion of the responsible National Coach and Team Manager (after receiving medical advice); or
- Demonstrates a lack of commitment to training requirements and/or competition preparation in the opinion of the responsible National Coach and Team Manager; or
- contravene the FEI or EFS Codes of Conduct, FEI Veterinary Regulations or EFS Rules and policies; or
- Fail to comply with the terms of their Athletes agreement; or
- Breaches or fails to fulfil the requirements of the Anti-Doping Policies of World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA), Anti-Doping Singapore and SNOC; or
- Encounters any travel delays, whether inadvertent or otherwise; or
- Suffers any equipment failure for any reason whatsoever



12.2 A horse selected for the 2026 Asian Games may be de-selected by SNOC/EFS from the team if:

- Due to illness or injury becomes unable to perform to the required standard in the opinion of the responsible National Coach and Team Manager (after undergoing a veterinary examination by the National Team Vet or by a vet nominated by the National Coach or Team Manager)
- Breaches or fails to fulfil the requirements of the Equine Anti-Doping & Controlled Medication Regulation (EADCMR) by FEI
