FINANCIALS

- Island Ignite 2023 cost approximately \$12K to run
- We received a Vancity Grant of \$3000 and a \$2000 BC Hydro Grant
- We received numerous donations outside of general sponsorship
- We are carrying forward a surplus in funds in preparation for Island Ignite 2024
- We have established a Return-It Express fundraising account current balance \$155.50

We will incorporate lessons learned from Island Ignite 2023 into planning our next event with the input of our expanding group of mentors and volunteers.
