3 SENTENCE TYPES: REVIEW

SIMPLE SENTENCE

- ONE Independent Clause (Subject + Verb/ Complete Thought)
- NO Dependent Clause

Xavier runs.

The guests ate dinner already.

We are going to the store right now.

COMPOUND SENTENCE

- TWO Independent Clauses
- Connected with a FANBOYS (For, And, Nor, But, Or, Yet, So) and a comma

We wanted to go out to eat, but we didn't have any money. Calculus is a difficult class, and it requires a lot of concentration.

COMPLEX SENTENCE

ONE Independent Clause + ONE (or more) Dependent Clause(s)

As soon as the sun came out, the kids ran outside to play. Elena is tired because she stayed up too late.
