Why is the Center moving?

A question that continues to be asked, and rightly so. When you love going someplace and then they move, you want to know why.

Here is the real answer – we are simply running out of space to offer what we consider quality programs in a space large enough to accommodate those interested in participating.

This was not a simple decision, nor was this decision made quickly by a small group of people who did not know what impact it would have on those who were currently coming to the Center and those who may choose to come in the future.

The current building has seen 3 separate additions. The first building was completed in 1983 by a small group of seniors who wanted/needed to find a place to meet. The exterior wall of the first building is across from Center's Front Desk. The second addition, the Dining Room and Kitchen, took place in 1989 and the final addition, the Lobby, Library and Computer Room took place in 2003.

5-6 years ago a building committee was formed to discuss the issue of how the Center could continue to best serve the growing senior population. The Center had a \$3,000,000.00 grant from the State of California, Department of Aging that was given to the Center with the understanding that an expanded Senior Center would be located in the Elk Grove area. With that in mind the Center formed a committee with representatives from the Senior Center's Board of Directors, Center members, community members and a City of Elk Grove representative with guidance from the Chief Council for the Department of Aging.

Why is the Center Moving? - Continued

The first plan was to find a way to stay in our current location. After careful research it was discovered that we could not add another floor to the building because the original building was not built to accommodate that concept. Next we discovered that we could not add to the building on the North side, because of the Heritage Oak trees, or the South side due to the limited parking spaces (66) in all, we could not build out the back patio area, due to limited space, nor could we take any space from Beeman Park.

Therefore we needed to consider finding another location. Seems simple, but not so. After research, we discovered that there was not a building in Elk Grove that would have lent itself to be renovated with the funds available. A feasibility study was done to determine what location would accommodate the greater number of seniors in Elk Grove both now and in the future. That location was and is where we are relocating to on the West side of Elk Grove, 8230 Civic Center Dr. Elk Grove, 95757, same telephone number (916) 685-3160.

Plans were discussed between the City of Elk Grove and the Senior Center to build a 27,000 square foot building for the Center alone. That too was found to be impossible considering what building costs are today. The next step was an offer from the City of Elk Grove for the Senior Center to be included in a building that was to house the Community Center. Then we began to work with the City and its architects to accomplish the goal of a multiuse building. At that time it was agreed that the Senior Center's \$3,000,000 would be transferred to the City of Elk Grove towards the costs of our portion of the building. The completed building will now house the Community Center, Senior Center and Veteran's Hall.

We hope this article helps everyone understand that moving the Senior Center's location was done with great thought and consideration as to how to best serve the senior community both now and in the future.

She also assisted in the development of new programs and partnerships for the Senior Center. Pat then served on the Senior Center's Board of Directors as Treasurer and then Board President for 3 years. Pat became the Executive Director of the Senior Center of Elk Grove in 2011.

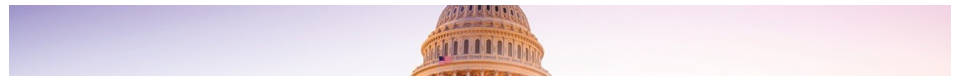
