

"IMPUTATION"

Rom 4:19 And being not weak in faith, he considered not his own body now dead, when he was about an hundred years old, neither yet the deadness of Sara's womb: 20 He staggered not at the promise of God through unbelief; but was strong in faith, giving glory to God; 21 And being fully persuaded that, what he had promised, he was able also to perform. 22 And therefore it was imputed to him for righteousness. 23 Now it was not written for his sake alone, that it was imputed to him; 24 But for us also, to whom it shall be imputed, if we believe on him that raised up Jesus our Lord from the dead; 25 Who was delivered for our offences, and was raised again for our justification. KJV

CREDIT money in a person's account, balance in a person's favor, money paid on account
ACCOUNT', To deem, judge, consider, think, or hold in opinion.
To account of, to hold in esteem; to value.

INVENTORY, To make an inventory of; to make a list, catalogue or schedule of; as, to inventory the goods and estate of the deceased.

ESTIMATE, valuing or rating in the mind; a judgment or opinion of the value, degree, to compute, to calculate, to reckon

Genesis 15:6 And he believed in the LORD; and he counted it to him for righteousness. 7 And he said unto him, I am the LORD that brought thee out of Ur of the Chaldees, to give thee this land to inherit it. KJV

James 2:23 And the scripture was fulfilled which saith, Abraham believed God, and it was imputed unto him for righteousness: and he was called the Friend of God.

IMPUTA'TION, *noun* The act of imputing or charging; attribution;

IMPU'TE to think, properly, to set, to put, to throw on to

Rom 9:7 Neither, because they are the seed of Abraham, are they all children: but, In Isaac shall thy seed be called. 8 That is, They which are the children of the flesh, these are not the children of God: but the children of the promise are counted for the seed. KJV

RECKON, To count; to number; To esteem; to account; to repute to compute; to calculate.

Rom 4:1 What shall we say then that Abraham our father, as pertaining to the flesh, hath found? 2 For if Abraham were justified by works, he hath whereof to glory; but not before God. 3 For what saith the scripture? Abraham believed God, and it was counted unto him for righteousness. 4 Now to him that worketh is the reward not reckoned of grace, but of debt. 5 But to him that worketh not, but believeth on him that justifieth the ungodly, his faith is counted for righteousness.
