Doxazo--an opinion, magnify, extol, praise. When Doxazo is predicated of Christ it means his innate Glory is brought to light.

### WEBSTER'S 1828

**Magnify:** Magnifico, magnus, great and facio, to make. To make great or greater: to increase the apparent dimensions of a body. To make great in representation; to extol: to exalt in description or praise. To elevate; to raise in estimation.

**Extol:** to raise in words or eulogy; to praise; to exalt in commendation; to magnify. We extol virtues Extol him that rideth upon the heavens by his name.

**Praise:** Commendation bestowed on a person for his personal virtues or worthy actions. Or on anything valuable; approbation expressed in words or song. Praise--to commend, to applaud, to express. To express gratitude for personal favors To do honor to; to display the excellence of.

**Honor:** The esteem due or paid to worth high estimation. A prophet is not without honor except in his own Country. Any expression of respect, or of high estimation by words or actions; dignity exalted, rank or place; distinction. Thou art clothed with honor and majesty.

**Glorification:** The act of giving Glory or of ascribing honors to. Exaltation to honor and dignity; elevation to glory; as the glorification of Christ after his resurrection.

**John 12:15** Fear not, daughter of Sion: behold, thy King cometh, sitting on an ass's colt. 16 These things understood not his disciples at the first: but when Jesus was glorified, then remembered they that these things were written of him, and that they had done these things unto him. KJV

**John 13:30** He then having received the sop went immediately out: and it was night. 31 Therefore, when he was gone out, Jesus said, Now is the Son of man glorified, and God is glorified in him. 32 If God be glorified in him, God shall also glorify him in himself, and shall straightway glorify him. KJV

**John 12:28** Father, glorify thy name. Then came there a voice from heaven, saying, I have both glorified it, and will glorify it again. KJV

**John 17:1** These words spake Jesus, and lifted up his eyes to heaven, and said, Father, the hour is come; glorify thy Son, that thy Son also may glorify thee: 2 As thou hast given him power over all flesh, that he should give eternal life to as many as thou hast given him. 3 And this is life eternal, that they might know thee the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom thou hast sent. 4 I have glorified thee on the earth: I have finished the work which thou gavest me to do. 5 And now, O Father, glorify thou me with thine own self with the glory which I had with thee before the world was. KJV
