Scott Hinkal- Who is the property going to be Deeded to? An individual or Corporation?

Nate Bollinger – It will be in an LLC.

<u>Nathan Johnson</u>- How soon are panels inspected if there is a storm or damage? <u>Bill Bollinger</u>- There is a Maintenance contact on the panels. They repair any panels as quickly as possible; time is money. They also hold Annual Inspections.

<u>Nathan Johnson</u>- Can Hazardous Materials leak from panels.

<u>Bill Bollinger</u>- In over the 12 years that they have been doing it, no materials have ever been leaked.

<u>Cindy Rutherford</u>- Have you reached out to the local fire departments to see if they can handle a fire at a solar farm?

Bill Bollinger- No

<u>Suzy Foresman-</u> Have you looked at 8400 panels? My home is directly across from where you are placing these and isn't something I want to look at every day. This is a Residential property not a commercial property.

Nathan Johnson- How much is impervious surface?

Nate Bollinger- 400-600 sq ft

Bill Bollinger- Only thing going into the ground is the T-bars.

<u>Nathan Johnson</u>- So this does not require an NPDES permit?

<u>Dan Vassallo</u>- No, you must disturb 43,680 ft of ground to require a permit. All panels are place by pounding a T-bar in ground and panels are mounted on top.

<u>Scott Hinkal-</u> How much acreage will the panels cover? <u>Bill Bollinger-</u> 11 acres

<u>Scott Hinkal-</u> How many existing trees will be removed? Bill Brown- Most trees have already been removed.
