A Very Special Visit: Bishop Debra Wallace -Padgett



Mission Opportunity - Food Kits for the Homeless

Asbury UMC has an opportunity to partner with CANUP (Coalition Addressing the Needs of Unhoused People) and provide food kits for those in need. CANUP delivers over 500 food kits a month to homeless individuals, estimated to be over 100 in our community during the last count conducted by the organization.

How can you help? The food kits consist of 9 items in a one gallon sized bag. The 9 categories are:

Category 1: protein - tuna or chicken in a package or can; beanie weenies, Vienna sausage, pork 'n beans, etc.

Category 2: individual-sized vegetable cups (peel top), typically sold 4 or more to a pack.

Category 3: individual-sized fruit cups (peel top)

Category 4: any kind of wrapped dessert - ie. Moon Pie, pudding, etc.

Category 5: small sleeve of Ritz crackers - comes several to a box

Category 6: small individual-sized chips - comes in a large box of assorted chips

Category 7: bottled water

Category 8: Peanut butter cups - sold 8 to a package

Category 9: Granola bars

Our goal is to package 50+ food kits a month. You can donate items from the categories above for volunteers to pack, build a kit yourself with all the items, or donate money and we'll do the shopping for you. Donations for the kits will be staged in the Wesley Room on the 1st floor by Sisters of Grace. Volunteers will assemble the kits the last Wednesday of each month. They will then be delivered to CANUP for distribution.

Guest Speakers at Asbury 150th Anniversary Celebrations





Guest Speakers at Asbury 150th Anniversary Celebrations



Rev. Mike Feely was our guest speak August 10th. Michael Feely serves as Director of Missions and Congregational Care at Christ UMC in Chattanooga. He has led ministries including Mountain TOP, Camp Lookout, and Henderson Settlement, and pastored churches in the Holston Conference. Michael has also served on Chattanooga's City Council, taught history as an adjunct professor, and held leadership roles with Habitat for Humanity, the Holston Foundation, and the Community Foundation.

He currently chairs the SEJ and Holston Conference Commissions on Archives and History, serves on the UMC General Commission on Archives and History, and edits *Historians Digest*. Michael and his wife, Annette, live in Chattanooga, where they enjoy time with their four adult children, a beloved old dog, and the Chattanooga Gospel Orchestra—where Michael occasionally plays trombone.





The Reverend Dr. Debra Wallace-Padgett was elected a Bishop of the United Methodist Church at the 2012 Southeastern Jurisdictional Conference. She served as the episcopal leader in the North Alabama Conference from 2012-2024, with the addition of the Holston Conference on September 1, 2021. On September 1, 2024, Bishop Wallace-Padgett began her new assignment in the Holston Conference of the Southeastern Jurisdiction and the West Virginia Conference of the Northeastern Jurisdiction.

At the time of her election, she was the lead pastor of St. Luke United Methodist Church in Lexington, Kentucky. During her tenure St. Luke grew in membership, strengthened its infrastructure, built a \$4.5 million Ministry Life Center, and launched a multi-cultural worship service. Prior to then, Wallace-Padgett served six years as Prestonsburg District Superintendent, three years as pastor of Paris First UMC,11 years on staff at Lexington First UMC, and two years as Director of Christian Education at Lexington Epworth UMC. She also provided leadership in a variety of roles in the Kentucky Annual Conference, Southeastern Jurisdiction, and General Church.

Bishop Wallace-Padgett was elected President of the World Methodist Council in Gothenburg, Sweden, on August 14, 2024. She has also served as President of the General Commission on the Status and Role of Women (2012-2016), a member of the Connectional Table (2012-2016), a member of the Commission on a Way Forward (2017-2019), and on the Council of Bishops Executive Committee (2014-2020), as well as chair of the Standing Committee on Evangelism for the World Methodist Council (2016-2024).

She is a graduate of Berea College (Bachelor of Arts in Physical Education), Scarritt College and Graduate School (Master of Arts in Christian Education), Lexington Theological Seminary (Master of Divinity), and Asbury Theological Seminary (Doctor of Ministry).

Bishop Wallace-Padgett is married to Reverend Lee Padgett, a retired deacon in the United Methodist Church. They are the parents of two adult children, Leanndra Thompson (Alexander) and Andrew Padgett, and have two granddaughters (Crindalyn and Raylena Thompson).

We put together three wonderful receptions for our guest speakers in June (Doris, Judy, Lynn & Frankie), July (Rebekah and Sandra) and August (Debby & Rebekah). Special thanks to all the ladies who contributed pastries, fruit, flowers and their time.
