Why We Celebrate Christ the King Sunday in the United Methodist Church

Christ the King Sunday is the final Sunday of the Christian liturgical year. In the UMC–as in many mainline traditions—we observe it to remember one central truth: Jesus Christ is Lord over all creation.

It reminds us who truly reigns.

The world has many "powers" that compete for our loyalty–politics, money, fear, division. Christ the King Sunday proclaims: Jesus, not any earthly power, is our true King. His kingdom is one of justice, peace, mercy, and love.

It re-centers the church before Advent.

This Sunday is placed right before Advent on purpose. Before we begin waiting for the baby in the manger, we remember that the baby is also the King of Kings. It's the Church's way of resetting our focus so we enter Advent with worship, not just holiday busyness.

It comes from a call to resist injustice and oppression.

The feast was originally established in 1925, during a period of rising nationalism, violence, and injustice worldwide. The Church wanted to make a bold statement: Christ–not dictators, not governments, not hatred–rules the world.

The UMC continues this tradition because it echoes our own calling to resist evil, injustice, and oppression in whatever forms they present themselves.

It challenges us to live as kingdom people.

As Methodists, we emphasize practical holiness–faith in action. Christ the King Sunday asks: If Jesus is your King, does your life show it?

We renew our pledge to live as disciples who bring Christ's love into the world.

Prayer of Confession

Liturgist:

God of Grace and mercy, we confess that we have rejected Your call to come closer to You. We have chosen to remain distant from You instead of running to You. You have what we need and yet, we have trouble surrendering to Your will for our lives.

People:

Lord, have mercy on us. Help us to draw nearer to you so that we might experience your healing power. Overshadow us with your love and give us a heart of gratitude.

Liturgist:

Lord remind us that we can't thank you enough for all you have done for us. We have failed to offer thanks for all the many blessings you have given us. Like the nine lepers who failed to say thank you, we have taken your healing touch for granted. Lord, remind us that everything we have is a gift from You.

People:

Lord forgive our oversight and make our hearts be like the one leper who can back with a heart filled with gratitude. Lord teach us to have a grateful heart.

All: We confess that we have failed to live in a posture of thankfulness. We have lived our lives in the balance between shame and pride. Often, we have cried unclean, unclean too many times. It is by You and through You that we are cleaned and made whole. Restore us and fill us with the joy of praise and thanksgiving. In all that is Holy, we pray. Amen.
