
Advent Pastor Blessings

District Superintendent Rev. Scott Spence



Rev. Scott Spence, a Saltville, Virginia native, was raised on a five-generation family farm that shaped his values of hard work, teamwork, and perseverance. Effective July 1, 2025, he serves as the **District Superintendent of the Appalachian District** in the Holston Conference.

Scott previously pastored Reynolds Memorial UMC, where he helped lead the collaborative HUB ministry in Bristol, VA and authored *On the Cusp*, a book on the church's evolving mission. He has also served Beech Grove UMC and the North Keywood Circuit, guiding each congregation toward growth, unity, and strengthened ministry.

He holds degrees from Emory & Henry College and Hood Theological Seminary, where he received the Tharrington Award for Outstanding Preaching. A survivor of a life-altering industrial accident in 1993, Scott shares his story as a powerful testimony to God's healing grace.

Scott and his wife, **Diane**, have been married 37 years and have two daughters, Autumn (married to Bobby) and Dianna.
