1 Corinthians 12:26–27 (NRSV): If one member suffers, all suffer together with it; if one member is honored, all rejoice together with it. 27 Now you are the body of Christ and individually members of it.



I am really feeling the scripture today. As we enter into the second week of social distancing, I know many of you are having a difficult time with how things are working out. As I look at Facebook, respond to emails, and make phone calls I hear where people find themselves. Some are doing well and enjoying this time, almost like an adventure. Some are struggling with the fact that people aren't doing what they're supposed to be doing and placing others along with themselves at risk.

The church in Corinth was having a difficult time in Paul's day. It was being persecuted by the community, and having difficulty from within, as people saw things differently. Some in the church believed that they were in the right and others were wrong. This even filtered into how they did communion. Paul's concern for the church was that this conflict was not only dividing them but having an adverse effect on their spiritual relationship with one another and with God.

My hope continues to be that we are growing closer as the body and in our spiritual walk with God. But this takes focused effort on our part, as we spend time daily in communion with God, seeking to be the body of Christ by reaching out to one another, and growing in the spirit through regular daily acts of worship. Perhaps you are wondering what this could look like? My encouragement to you is to begin each day in the word of God. Spend time each day reaching out to your neighbors, your sisters and brothers in the body of Christ, family and friends. Then find a favorite musician from Spotify or Pandora, perhaps tune in the local radio station while they are playing gospel music, and spend some time in worship. If you are a person that experiences the worship of our Lord and Savior in the out-of-doors then I strongly encourage you to get outdoors daily!

Let's continue to lift one another up and remember when one suffers we all suffer when one rejoices we all rejoice. We are the body of Christ!


FLAT JESUS SIGHTINGS

On July 5, 1924, The Democrat Sun published the story of Asbury's Women's Home


Missionary Society's purchase of a lot on Highland Avenue for Miss Elsie Gass who was doing full-time mission work in Greeneville. She collected food, clothing, and household goods to distribute to the needy.

Miss Elsie was born in the Cross Anchor community in 1882 and spent several years as a teacher in the Greene County Schools. After teaching for 11 years, she moved to Greeneville.

She lived with her brother Bill in a large frame house at 501 Tusculum Blvd, the present site of the Opportunity House Thrift Store.

She raised money by selling holly and mistletoe to buy Christmas baskets for the needy. She was helped by the United Way when it came to Greeneville. Mayor James Hardin honored her with a day in her honor, and she was among 14 Greene Countians who were included in the Lawrence B. Britton

Gallery of Distinguished Greene Countians.

ELSIE GASS MISSION

The Women's Home Missionary Society of the Asbury Memorial Church has purchased a lot on Highland Avenue extension at a cost of \$150.00, upon which the friends of the cause are asked to erect a building primarily for the use of the Sunday School now being conducted by Miss Elsie Gass, in "Clem's Woods," on the North side of town. The building to be erected is to be forever free to the use of any Christian denomination for the conducting of religious services under the direction of the Missionary Society.

Contributions have already been made sufficient to erect a substantial "box" house with galvanized iron roof and subfloor; and the promoters of the enterprise are hoping that sufficient additional donations will be made to put windows and doors in the building, and seat it.

Contributions may be made either through the Democrat-Sun or to Miss Elsie Gass, or to the committee appointed by the, Home Missionary Society, which committee is composed of Mesdames Oral Anderson, S. N. Leming and DeWitt Fry, or to J. W. Howard, teacher of the Asbury Bible Class.

It is hoped that the Bible classes, and other Christian organizations of the town will aid in this, one of the most improtant efforts of Christian service that has been offered our people in a long time.

All contributions are purely free will offerings. There has not been anything like a canvass of the town made, and there will not be. If you are interested in the movement, and would like to help it along, do not wait to be called upon, for no such personal call will be added to what is here written.

When the necessary material is assembled on the ground, the Asbury Bible Class is going to ask all the people of the town to join with them, on a designated day, and go upon the premises and erect the house in a day.


