In reflecting on the last year, I am struck by the confusion and turmoil, by the frustration and struggles that have challenged all of us. Certainly, prayer has been at the forefront of everything we do, from beginning meetings to expanding the sharing of local concerns within the life of the church. Everything we have done has been covered in prayer and I want to thank you for such wonderful support.

In the early church prayer was an important part of daily community life. Everything was bathed in prayer, both corporate and individual. When you think of the early church and the challenges that came with sharing the gospel during that time, they could not have done it without prayer. Certainly, the challenges we have faced in the past year could not have been met without prayer.

As we prepare for the next season of ministry I invite you to join us in praying for our community. Recognizing that moving forward from Covid-19 things will be different for everyone, and especially difficult for many of our local businesses. At Asbury we want the people of Greeneville and Greene county to know we are here for them, and perhaps more importantly praying for them.

Currently, we have regular weekly praises and prayer concerns shared with the congregation during worship on Sunday morning and by email on Monday. When people ask we visit, lay hands, anoint with oil and pray. People have been prayed for in person, on the phone, via email, and over zoom.

To more effectively serve the prayer needs of our community we will provide prayer cards to the Church Family that may be shared. We will also provide these cards to local businesses and organizations to be shared with their patrons. Each card will include a new prayer email address (prayer@asburylife.org) and contact information for the church. This email will be checked at least twice a day and responded to. In responding to these emails we will verify if these requests may be shared publicly on Sunday, or if they are to be kept semi-private within the needs of the community.

We will open our prayer room daily. This will enable members of the Asbury family to come in and pray for the needs of our community as well as the prayer concerns of the congregation. We will also look for ways to open the prayer room to our community.

I hope you will join me in the ministry of making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world, by praying today for our community, our friends, and our neighbors.



### **Church Maintenance Updates-Keith Cornwell**




Mulching and landscaping of the flower beds around the church campus is in progress.

Imagine how difficult it must have been for the bent over woman, who had suffered for 18 years, to show up at the synagogue that day. None of the healers or rabbis had been able to help her. The pain she must have endured to just "show up" on that Sabbath! Wouldn't it have been easier to just stay at home? Instead she chose to be courageous and faithful in prayer. Can you imagine how difficult it must have been for Mary Magdalene and Mary the mother of James and Joseph to "show up" at the tomb that morning? The women were courageous to stay with Jesus through the trial and crucifixion. Wouldn't it have been easier to avoid any whispers and stares by staying home that morning? They too chose to be courageous and show up remaining faithful in prayer.

These stories reveal the courage to be faithful and "show up" which opens us to receive the grace of Jesus Christ. The good news of Easter is that when we choose to be faithful in prayer, we are met by the risen Christ. Being set free from whatever barriers we face should encourage us to share the "good news" with great joy!






### **Virtual Prom Closet**






