Luke 24: 38 "Why are you troubled? He asked them. "And why do doubts arise in your hearts?"

I like Lent! I like the journey of self discovery and drawing nearer to Jesus. It's a seven week period of being able to own my sin and understand that even though I don't have everything worked out and right it is all going to be okay. In Lent I can convince myself that it is about the journey and the fact I don't have all of my sin surrendered is okay. My eyes can be awakened to the sin in my life and it is okay because Easter is coming. However, Easter is here. Jesus is risen, Satan is defeated and the battle for my soul is won!

For 25 years I have struggled after Easter. I convince myself it is because of all the hours put in during Holy Week, but the truth is I, like the disciples, struggle with doubts. Doubts that were okay during lent are supposed to be rolled away like the stone on Easter morning. The tomb is empty! Hallelujah! I believe this. I believe Jesus won. He came as the one person capable of following the law and living out the law. He showed us how to live it out in love. He gave grace and mercy. He was killed for it. And just as surely as I preach, teach, and write about it the sin in my life put him on the cross. It drove the nails into his hands and feet. It pierced his side.

The disciples were trying to figure things out. What did it all mean? They saw Jesus crucified. They spent their sabbath in shock and mourning. Then on Sunday these amazing stories start to come out. One of the women said she saw him; two of their group say they saw him on the road to Emmaus. Suddenly Jesus was there. He didn't knock. He didn't come through the door. Jesus was just there! Can you imagine?

Why are you troubled? Why would you not be? Everything you've ever known about life has just been turned upside down. Death is no longer the end, the resurrection is real! The stone is rolled away and the tomb is empty. Jesus is who he said he was, is and will be. I am troubled because I am a sinner. Because I know I should do better and I don't. I do the very things that I hate. Paul struggled with this and so did Job. The victory is complete except in the hearts of those who are troubled; except where Satan works on the hearts of believers. Why are you troubled? And why do doubts arise in your hearts? The stone has been rolled away and the tomb is empty. That is why.

MARCH MONTHLY MISSION SPORTLIGHT Change for Children

What is change for children you ask? This is a mission that Asbury has been participating in for well over 20 years. Since Covid, it has been paused here at Asbury, but that is going to change beginning May 1.

Change for Children is a dedicated Sunday once a month, where our children collect pocket changes from the congregation. The pocket changed collected is deposited and a lump sum is taken to Annual Conference in June of every year. All pocket change collected becomes funds available for Holston churches and other Methodist related ministries around the world in grant form.

These grants support new and existing ministries with economically disadvantaged children, birth to 5th grade, and their families. Churches must apply for the grant funds, by completing an application, detailing ministry or ministry outreach funds will be applied. These grants are awarded twice a year, February and August. These grants are for direct program support and not for construction or renovations to buildings or playgrounds. Consideration is given for equipment and upgrades that enhance the program and builds relationships with children and families. The maximum program grant is \$2500 and grant recipients may apply again in two years.

Asbury has our Change for Children collection in the past as you exit the service. Beginning in May, however, we are revamping our collection process. We will begin on May 7, Family worship Sunday. Be on the lookout for our special collection of pocket change during the service.
