Mark 1:15 "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent, and believe in the good news."

These are the words Jesus spoke to people in Galilee following the arrest of John the Baptist. Verse 14 says Jesus went to Galilee, "preaching the good news!" Just in case the audience misses it he doubles down using Jesus' very own words in the next verse. So the greek word is "euangelio," which literally means "good tidings." What are the good tidings of Jesus?

Jesus' message seems to be twofold; repent and believe. All the people of Galilee would have understood the first part easily. Repentance is not really a great mystery. The problem was that for most who were hearing Jesus' message that were so beaten down by Rome and the Pharisees that meeting the requirements for repentance was hard. This is part of what makes Jesus' message so counter cultural. In order for people to repent, they had to go to the priest and make the proper sacrifice. But between unemployment and taxes they couldn't afford the sacrifice.

The sacrificial system that was at work in Jerusalem involved changing Roman money to "temple" money and then purchasing an "approved" sacrificial animal. This was the environment that Jesus came into and overturned the tables. So, the good new Jesus includes a new forgiveness paradigm. All you need to do is repent, literally change your mind. You don't have to wait on the priest, or wait on the money for a sacrifice, you just have to stop doing what you are doing and change your mind. (I personally like "turn around" as a translation.)

So what about "believe?" Believe that the "Kingdom of Heaven has come near!" This is the Message that the Messiah is bringing. People no longer have to wait. God is near! The barriers that have separated people from God are done away and the Kingdom of God is near. In Matthew, Mark and Luke Jesus refers to the Kingdom of God 53 times. Jesus has come that the people, ALL THE PEOPLE will believe in the Kingdom. But the Good news is not simply that it has come but that it is near! Several times he follows the message up with a very pointed be ready.

I want to say that nothing in the last 2000 years has changed the good news of Jesus. You don't have to do anything special but simply turn around, but that is not the Good News. The Good News is that the Kingdom is near! Emmanuel, God is with us.

I close with Paul's words in Acts 14:15 Friends, why are you doing this? We are mortals just like you, and we bring you good news, that you should turn from these worthless things to the living God, who made the heaven and the earth and the sea and all that is in them.

Repent and Believe the Good News!



In July we saw some of our youth helping with VBS. It was a great time for all involved! Thank you not only to the youth and adult volunteers but thank you to Mrs. Kim for all that she does throughout the year to make VBS week something special. Helping in VBS got me to thinking about some new ideas for youth and trying to figure out how to make them happen. So be on the lookout for something exciting!

One thing that was hosted by the youth was a meal and talk session with George and Cindy Tvardy on mental health and teens. The session was incredibly informative and helpful. All that attend had positive feedback and I look forward to working with George and Cindy again in the near future. The night was so engaging that I completely forgot to take pictures! I guess you will have to attend the next youth sponsored event to get in on the action!

During our talk George told us the best thing we can do for our kids is to show them they are special. He gave us an example and basically, we need to show up and be present. Make time for one-on-one time with each of your children. Be a safe space for our youth in which they feel comfortable coming to us to talk about anything. (He also said we need to make sure our responses are appropriate.) I thought this was a professional recommendation that needed to be shared. Thank you, again, George and Cindy, for sharing your time and knowledge with us.

Now looking forward! August is here! School is starting. Church is getting back into the swing of weekly things. Life is going to fall back into the rhythm of the school year. As you plan your days, remember to put youth events on your calendar. We will be meeting one Sunday evening a month as a group, and then the 4th Sunday of the month for Confirmation. Then on Wednesdays we meet right after school in the youth room. We will have time for homework, worship, a game, and a lesson. We will also share in a meal together in the Fellowship Hall.

Something new we are starting this year is small groups. Like I explained to a volunteer with our youth earlier, the small groups are meant to be student led, adult guided. These groups will run for 6 weeks at a time and meet at various times throughout the week. This first 6 weeks we will have 3 small groups for youth to choose from; *The Man* Talks, New, and *Can I Ask That?*. The hope is that we can continue to offer small groups to help dive deeper in both the Bible, and more importantly, our relationships with each other. I'm so excited to start the new year!

And last, but not least, we are looking for folks to join us in various ways. Whether you feel called to volunteer within our lessons, provide a meal, pray for/with us, or something else, we would love for you to partner with us. We have some of the most amazing young adults and they would love to have you join us.
