Romans 8:35 Who will separate us from the love of Christ? Will hardship, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword?



My devotion time this morning centered around this verse from Paul. It seems like a lot of times we get focused on the things that make us different or the things that separate us from one another. Now the important part of what Paul is saying here is that this is a rhetorical question. As we look at the word order and syntax from the greek the implication is that Paul has, in fact, experienced all these things because of the gospel of Jesus Christ and they have not separated him from Christ.

There was a period of time when people did feel separated because of persecution. There are even places in the world today where this type of persecution still exists, where you could be called on to sacrifice your life for your faith in Christ. Fortunately we here in the U.S., specifically in east Tennessee, do not live in one of these places. So then what is it that separates us?

We disagree on baptism, who should receive it, and how it should be administered. We disagree on who can preach and how they can dress to do the preaching. We manufacture hardship and distress. We feel persecution, and that our liberties are in peril. All in the name of... What?

Jesus, who died on the cross, delivers us from Sin and death. In the cross, we are no longer separated but united. Wesley is attributed with the idea that as long as we agree on the crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus Christ we can join one another at the table. The cross is what should unite us. It is why Jesus went to the cross. One of my favorite Cross stories is from Matthew 27:54, where the centurion guarding Jesus on the cross witnesses his death accompanied by the earthquake, he believes. Picture the people at the foot of the Cross; John the disciple, Mary the mother, Mary Magdalen, the Centurion, could they be more different and it is the cross that unites them.

Romans 8:37 says "we are more than conquerors through him who loved us." We are more than conquerors because of the cross. When we come to the cross the things that separate us are cast aside and no longer matter. For the Cross unites all through the blood of Jesus. We don't have to agree on anything else as long as we can agree on Jesus dying on the cross and being resurrected. Then the law, sin, and death no longer have a hold over us, only the love that held Jesus to the cross.

Scripture reading: Judges 11: 9-40


I hope by sharing these program highlights, you will be able to feel more connected to what is taking place in the UMW.






Asbury Family Ministries will once again be sending care packages to our college students. If you would like to help, listed below are needed items.






