Matthew 22:2
"The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who gave a wedding banquet for his son

I really like the parables where Jesus compares the Kingdom to a banquet. Generally there is a group that's invited and some come when it is ready but some make excuses. Sometimes there is an element where those who were invited really don't want to come and mistreat the servants who have brought the invitation. The master wants the table full, and so the servants do everything they are instructed to do and there is still room. I really like that part of the story, there is room at God's table for everyone.

The United Methodist Church finds itself in a season of change. For some this season means no longer being United Methodist, for some it means waiting and for still others it means staying United Methodist. In Greeneville and Greene county quite a few of our smaller sister churches have engaged in this conversation of disaffiliation. I hope you will join me in praying for these sisters and brothers during this time. These are not easy conversations and to complicate matters there is so much information to sort through.

Some of our sister churches have felt comfortable waiting. As United Methodist we are well practiced at the art of waiting. We wait every four years for the coming of the General Conference. We wait every year for the coming of the annual conference and the fixing of appointments. We wait on a lot of things and since 2019 it seems like the next General Conference can not get her soon enough. For those who are waiting they rely on the process of being a United Methodist. Our Book of Discipline has not changed since 2019, and the things that we believe to be foundational to the Christian faith have been essentially unchanged since we were formed as a denomination.

There are a lot of conversations being had and a lot of questions being asked. If you have questions or would like to talk about the challenges we are facing as denomination please let me know. We can make time to sit down individually or in a group. I don't profess to know all the answers but I know the one who does. I encourage you to join me in praying for all the United Methodist Churches and our leadership as we move toward General Conference 2024.

In the parable we begin with the King comes to the banquet. The banquet where the servants "compelled" people to come to the King's table. When the King arrives He meets someone who doesn't have on the proper wedding banquet attire. They showed up to the banquet unprepared and the King had them cast out. I think it could be said that it would be better not to come than to come unprepared. It is my goal as the pastor of Asbury United Methodist Church to help all of the Asbury family be prepared, whatever the future may hold.

The Grace of Baptism in Our United Methodist Connection "I planted the seed, Apollos watered it, but God made it grow." – 1 Cor. 3:6

My father and mother moved to Greeneville, TN in January of 1976. My father had accepted the position of Director of Music and Youth at Asbury United Methodist Church. My mother was VERY pregnant with me at the time, and a few weeks later, on February 15, 1976 (a date that will live in infamy) I was born. Not long after that – perhaps March or April – I was baptized into the Church. Unable to speak for myself, my parents and the people of Asbury Church made a covenant with God: they agreed to raise me to know the grace and love of Jesus Christ until I was able to profess faith for myself. My parents moved from Greenville to Johnson City, TN two years later. My father had accepted another job opportunity at Munsey Memorial United Methodist Church as Minister of Music. Munsey Church continued the covenant that Asbury Church took on the day of my baptism. A year or so later, my mother would become the organist at Colonial Heights United Methodist Church. Colonial Heights Church also joined in continuing my baptismal covenant (y'all – it takes a village to raise a pastor).

I have been blessed over the course of my life to be connected to multiple congregations. Each one has loved me into discipleship as I learned to walk with Jesus (and I'm still learning to walk with Jesus). I can remember every sanctuary, and I can name at least one person from every congregation that made a difference in my life. However, there is one congregation about which I remember nothing: Asbury Church. I don't remember the day I was baptized.

I don't remember the sanctuary of Asbury Church, nor do I remember a single parishioner. Yet, it was Asbury Church and no other that surrounded my parents with love and first loved me, stating on my behalf:

With God's help we will proclaim the good news and live according to the example of Christ.

We will surround Randy with a community of love and forgiveness, that he may grow in his service to others.

We will pray for him, that he may be a true disciple who walks in the way that leads to life.

Asbury Church loved me and baptized me into the faith. They poured themselves into me that I might become a disciple of Jesus Christ...never knowing if I would.

Asbury Church is a wonderful example of the grace of baptism in our United Methodist Connection: they planted, others watered, and God did the growing. Asbury Church was never able to see me grow up. They didn't witness my profession of faith. They didn't see me stumble, fall away, and come back. Nor did they watch me get married, have children, or take my ordination vows. The seed planted in me by one United Methodist Church in the mountain south, has now pastored United Methodist congregations throughout central Pennsylvania, including my current appointment in the state Capital. I'm certain that the people of Northeastern Tennessee and Central Pennsylvania did not see this outcome. They simply practiced their faith, planting and watering, and God did the rest.

As I close this article, I want to thank all the congregations who have planted and watered me along the way. I would invite you to do the same for those in your prayer life. I give thanks to God for the following congregations: Asbury UMC – Greeneville, Munsey UMC – Johnson City, Colonial Heights UMC – Kingsport, Gravelly Baptist Church (Mamaw's Church – Kingsport), St. John's Episcopal – Johnson City, Guaranda Drive Baptist – Johnson City, First UMC – Johnson City, The Wesley Foundation – ETSU, Farview UMC – Jonesborough, Rogersville UMC – Rogersville, Lake Junaluska Singers – Lake Junaluska, Erwin Presbyterian Church – Erwin, Zion UMC – York, Trinity UMC – New Freedom, Paxtonville UMC – Paxtonville, Christ Community UMC – Selinsgrove, and Calvary UMC – Harrisburg. Thank-you for surrounding me with a community of love and forgiveness. I am alive in Christ because of your ministry and the grace of God.

Modeled after a program of the same type in North Carolina, Mrs. Barbara and other UMW members began "The Blessed Dress Ministry," The event continues today as being one of Asbury's most important ministries. Not only do young ladies in our on community look forward to this every year, but we now are able to help young ladies in all of Upper East Tennessee and Southwest Virginia.

Asbury Family Ministries took over the Prom Closet in 2019, with continued support from Asbury UMW. Gently used and new Prom dresses are resold in a Boutique like fashion store on the third Saturday of March. Each dress is only \$10 and all funds are used to purchase dresses the next year. Young ladies 8th –12th grade are invited to shop on the given day and try on dresses to find that dream dress. There is nothing like seeing the smile on the young ladies face and their parents face when they put that perfect dress on and look ravishing.




# Natasha DeBord Director of Student Ministries
