John 17: 23 I in them and you in me, that they may become completely one, so that the world may know that you have sent me and have loved them even as you have loved me.

There has been a lot of talk about Unity and Division. A lot of talk about trying to figure out who we are and what things mean. In light of all this, I found Tim Massey's Greeneville Sun article "Brothers Divided Always United" especially poignant. In my time here in Greeneville on more than one occasion, I have been struck by what the late 1800's must have been like in our community as people navigated the social and political landscape of the day. In my mind it is unfair to compare different time periods or even how people responded to issues of their day. But I also understand that a lot of these conversations come down to authority.

I believe in the authority of God. I believe that God has given us the word of scripture through divine inspiration. Depending on your particular translation of scripture there are approximately 31,102 verses of scripture. There are 23,145 verses in the Old Testament and 7,957 verses in the New Testament. This is God's word divinely inspired through the writing, the reading and the understanding. This inspiration comes to us through the Holy Spirit.

In the United Methodist Church we say: We share with many Christian communions a recognition of the authority of Scripture in matters of faith, the confession that our justification as sinners is by grace through faith, and the sober realization that the church is in need of continual reformation and renewal. It's almost like in the 1960's when these things were being written down to help guide the United Methodist church. There was an understanding that issues of unity and division were bound to occur. But rather than give in to the ideas of division and disunity, they saw it as an opportunity for the indwelling of the Holy Spirit to draw people together through scripture.

In bringing together the Evangelical United Brethren and the Methodist churches, they included both of their doctrinal standards. Each of these are included in the book of discipline today. The doctrinal standards of the two churches are very similar but not exact. But rather than focusing on the differences people choose to see the good that these churches could do together. Imagine if on that first Pentecost people had focused on the different languages that were being heard as opposed to what the people were saying.

On Sunday June 5, 2022, we will gather to celebrate Pentecost. Then that Sunday evening at Lake Junaluska, for the 1st time since 2019, Holston conference will gather. We will worship together, we will celebrate the work of the body of Christ, and we will look to the future. I hope you will join me in praying for the Holston annual conference and the delegates as we give ourselves to the work of Holy-conferencing, and drawing together to be one in Christ.

Alexandra Duckworth is the daughter of Lee and Lori Duckworth. She plans on attending the University of Tennessee in the fall where she will major in animal sciences.




Grayson Hite is the son of Shane and Stephanie Hite. He plans on attending the University of Tennessee where he plans on majoring in criminal justice.




