Mark 10:17 As he (Jesus) was setting out on a journey, a man ran up and knelt before him, and asked him, "Good Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?"

As we come through this season of Charge Conference, which includes the meeting of the Southeast Jurisdictional Conference, I am very aware of questions. The questions that get asked and that don't get asked. The questions that are answered and the questions that are avoided. Sometimes I think people are afraid to ask questions. There are many reasons for that, they might not really want to know the answer or they're afraid of the answer. Sometimes people are not sure what question to ask.

Did you know Jesus asked 307 questions in the gospels? He was asked 183 questions, and actually only answered 3. This is the subject of a book by Martin Copenhaver. I didn't do an exhaustive checking of the facts on this but from a cursory view it looks correct. I would even go as far as to say that if you asked Jesus a question, you can almost guarantee he will ask you two in return. In some cases he says he will answer the question if the person asking will answer him.

I want to encourage you to ask the questions that are on your heart and mind, even if you may not like the answer. Not asking seems to lead to frustration and confusion and also leaves us susceptible to information that may not be based in fact. In the scripture from the gospel of Mark, a young man has a question: "What must I do to inherit eternal life?" For someone who has been putting forth his best effort it might seem a strange question. Especially in a time when putting in the work seems to be the most important thing. But like a lot of people who ask questions he seems to understand that something is missing or at the very least not complete.

We also need to be prepared for the answer. To many of the questions that get asked today there are not always clear cut right answers and sometimes there are. There is a clear cut answer to the young man's question of Jesus: "What must I do to inherit eternal life?" Surrender everything and follow Jesus! I encourage you today that if you have questions, ask them. If you do not like the answer, ask a followup question.


I do not profess to know the answers to all the questions today, but I know the one who does. If you have a question please ask it.

Asbury Family Marker Dedication

On Saturday, October 22, 2022, at 2:00 p. m., a marker was dedicated at Oak Grove Cemetery for the family of the Reverend John Summerfield "Summer" Petty who served as the pastor of Asbury from 1874 to 1876 and 1880 to 1882. He was responsible for aiding the congregation to locate the property where the current church stands and build the first Methodist Episcopal Church on the site. Nine months after he arrived on June 29, 1875, his wife Sarah "Sallie" Ann Hunt Petty died in the parsonage which was half of the former Maloney Hotel. She was buried at Oak Grove. On June 16, 1882, Petty's 16-month-old son Keibert by his second wife died and was buried beside Sallie. While Petty was serving a church in Morristown, his 21-year-old daughter May died on Sept. 3, 1888, and was brought back to Greeneville by train after her funeral in Morristown. The Pettys lost a three-month-old-child, Charles in June of 1889 who was also buried in the family plot. The last child buried in Greeneville was Hazel, born to Petty and his third wife, who died on June 5, 1897. Her mother died three days later. John Summerfield Petty was a Union Veteran who is buried at the Chattanooga National Cemetery with his fourth wife.

His great-grandson Dave Robinson and his wife Kay from Grapevine, Texas, purchased the marker, and he gave the Dedication Speech for his family members after the site of their graves was located in the Spring of 2021.
