Luke 15:17 But when he came to himself he said, 'How many of my father's hired hands have bread enough and to spare, but here I am dying of hunger!



How many of us feel this way? Like we are trying to wake up from a bad dream. It does seem like for six months we have been living someone else's life and we are waiting for tomorrow to come so things can get back to normal. In this story from the gospel of Luke, the youngest son has left his family. He has squandered his inheritance and now he finds himself feeding pigs. Perhaps this is a familiar story to you. It's one of the favorites of evangelists around the world, because of the love and grace that the father shows.

It is true that the father responds with so much mercy, as he is depicted waiting on his son to "come to himself." When he finally sees him, he runs to meet him. He embraces him, puts shoes on his feet, a ring on his finger, wraps him in a purple robe, and kills the fatted calf to celebrate. The son is again a part of the family. The actions that separated him from his father are forgiven and dare I say forgotten (by the father, the eldest son is a different story.) But look at the story; none of this happens without the young man coming to himself.

Many have had the experience of working at a job we do not like. Why did we ultimately leave it? Many have had the experience of being in relationships that did nothing but take. This young man had friends as long as he had money. He didn't have to leave them, they left him. The place where he found himself was not entirely of his own making though. Look at what happens. He squandered the inheritance and then the famine came. We can't blame him for the famine. Sure if he had done better at living his life he would have been better off. If he had never been so insolent as to leave home, he wouldn't be where he is now. But does that make the famine his fault too? No, but it does make him responsible for how he responds to that situation.


I have always enjoyed this transformative moment. In Hollywood RomCom, this would be where the hero understands what must be done to receive true love. You can see the light bulb come on. Feeding the pigs and thinking I am so hungry maybe I could eat some of "this." Wait a minute! "He came to himself!" And he returns home. I think we all have these transformative moments in our lives. These moments when we are drawn back to God.

Very rarely do we make this kind of conscious decision to leave. More often we just simply drift away in the sea of life. But what do we find when we come to ourselves and come back to God. God has been waiting for just that moment. God is watching for us, waiting to reconcile us to the family, to claim us again as children. If only we will come to ourselves. Truly nothing can separate us from the love of God.

- 1 Hand towel (No kitchen, cleaning or microfiber towels)
- 1 Washcloth
- 1 Comb (No pocket combs, must be sturdy)
- 1 Toenail or fingernail clipper
- 1 Bath size soap (3 oz or larger)
- 1 Adult toothbrush (Do not remove from package)
- 10 Adhesive bandages (3/4 x 3")

## Common household bandages acceptable

Include \$3.00 for shipping donation

1 Gallon re-sealable bag

#### **Assembly Instructions**

Lay hand towel flat.

Lay washcloth in the center of hand towel.

Place all remaining items on top of washcloth, except plastic bag.

Fold the sides of the hand towel to cover the items.

Grasp the bundle tightly and roll over the remainder of the towel.

Place the tightly rolled bundle in the plastic bag, remove air, & seal


#### **PARKING LOST PARABLES**


