These loyal participants in the services provide solos as well as ensemble music while leading the worship service all during the year. They invite others to join them in their worship experiences as well as the enjoyment of each other in their practice sessions and outings. Reading music is NOT a requirement—only enjoying singing is essential. Members will gladly help new members to learn the songs and more about music. Thank you church family - we met our goal!

One hundred personal hygiene kits for Liberia, along with a check for \$800 to cover the shipping costs, were delivered by Asbury to our district office in Morristown this past week. Thanks to your generous donations, we were able to meet our ambitious goal of 100 that the UMW and our Youth set for our church back in March. These hygiene kits, which include shampoo, body lotion, toothbrushes, toothpaste, deodorant, body spray, wash cloth, hand towel, ibuprofen and anti-bacterial ointment, were added to the kits collected from other churches within the Mountain View District to hopefully meet the District's goal of 500 kits. The collected kits will go to the Holston Annual Conference, where after prayer and a big celebratory send-off, the kits will be shipped to Liberia. Thank you for allowing us to be a part of this vital ministry, participating in the Great Commission by sharing the good news of the love of Jesus Christ through these gifts.
