Lay Leader's Report to Church Council

Asbury's health is measured not only by attendance, but by lives shaped through connection, service, and community. During this reporting period, we have seen steady and encouraging engagement across worship, small groups, service ministries, and digital outreach—affirming the shared vision our congregation has named.

As community need has grown, Asbury has responded faithfully. Benevolence, CANUP food kits, and the warming shelter continue to be powerful expressions of our mission and are strengthening relationships both within the church and beyond it.

Small groups remain our strongest pathway for connection and spiritual growth, with increased participation in the second half of the year and clear opportunities to expand reach. Worship attendance has stabilized, livestream worship continues to extend our welcome, and contemporary worship represents an important opportunity to reach younger adults and families.

While we face real demographic challenges, we are also seeing hopeful signs—especially through growing digital engagement and new community partnerships that introduce Asbury to people exploring faith and new residents in Greene County.

Volunteer leadership is one of Asbury's greatest strengths. Faithful service has allowed us to expand ministry impact, and continued growth will come as we invite more people into leadership and shared responsibility.

Rooted in the United Methodist call to **love boldly, serve joyfully, and lead courageously**, Asbury is a church with a strong foundation, a clear direction, and a future filled with hope.
